# **Swimming in Augsburg**

Water is omnipresent in Augsburg and brings the city to life. Augsburg has nine swimming pools, four lakes, canals and rivers. You must adhere to the bathing rules in all indoor and outdoor pools.

**Very important:** If you can't swim, never go into the water deeper than your knees! Many people drown every year because they can't swim. They don't realise that it is very dangerous to go into a river or lake.

### Rivers and lakes

If you like swimming in lakes, Augsburg has a choice of four bathing lakes. Swimming in rivers is also permitted. Swimming in canals is generally not permitted. There are only a few exceptions.

#### Kuhsee

Kuhsee has very good water quality. The water rescue centre is manned at weekends. There are barbecue areas, three kiosks and a restaurant with boat hire on the shore. It was given the name Kuhsee because in the past, herds of cows were led here to drink. The water quality of the Kuhsee is very good.

### Bergheimer Baggersee

The small, idyllic Bergheimer Baggersee is beautifully situated in the west of Augsburg. A visit can be wonderfully combined with a cycle tour along the Wertach or in the western forests. Lifeguards from the Göggingen water rescue service are on site at weekends. The lake has very good water quality.

## **Motorway lake**

Here you will find large sunbathing lawns, shady trees and several barbecue areas. Many people like to come here to swim. The lake has very good water quality.

#### Naturfreibad Haunstetten

You can swim in unchlorinated water at Naturfreibad Haunstetten. The lake has very good water quality. The lake is over 10,000 square metres in size. There is also a kiosk, a beach volleyball court and a children's playground on site.

### Lake IIse

A lake for divers and swimmers. It has spacious sunbathing areas for relaxing. At weekends, the Königsbrunn water rescue service ensures safe swimming.

### Lech, Wertach and Augsburg canals

Swimming in rivers is permitted. Swimming in canals is generally not permitted. There are only a few exceptions. Sunbathing lawns designated by the Office for Green Regulations are regularly mowed and cleaned. Unlike bathing lakes, there are no lifeguards on site.
