Attention: Ticks in Augsburg - TBE risk area

Augsburg is part of a TBE risk area. This means that there are many ticks here that can transmit the TBE virus.

What is TBE?

TBE is a disease. The long name is tick-borne encephalitis. It is an inflammation of the brain or nerves. The disease can be serious. You can get severe headaches, fever or even paralysis.

How do you get TBE?

TBE is contracted through a tick bite. Not every tick has the virus - but some do. If a tick with TBE virus bites you, you can become ill.

How can I protect myself?

Going out into nature is great - but you should be careful:

- Wear sturdy clothing: long trousers, socks and closed shoes.
- Use tick repellent on your skin and clothing.
- Check your body after the walk - especially children.
- If you have a dog, check your dog too.
- If you find a tick: Remove it immediately!

Is there a vaccination?

Yes, there is a vaccination against TBE. The vaccination provides good protection against the disease.

- The vaccination consists of three injections.
- Two injections are given a few weeks apart.
- The third injection is given after a few months.
- You are then protected for several years.


💡 You can have the vaccination done by your GP.

Health insurance usually pays for the vaccination - especially in risk areas such as Augsburg.

Work opportunities for asylum seekers

New rules for work opportunities have applied since the end of February 2024. Refugees who receive benefits under the Asylum Seekers' Benefits Act (AsylbLG) can now work under new conditions.

 This text provides a general overview of work opportunities. It is not legally binding. Detailed and binding information can be found on the [website of the City of Augsburg](#).

What are work opportunities?

- Work opportunities are simple jobs for asylum seekers, tolerated persons and persons obliged to leave the country who receive money under the Asylum Seekers' Benefits Act (AsylbLG).
- If you have such a job, you will receive a small allowance.
- The work is not-for-profit, which means it helps society.

What are the advantages of work opportunities?

- You can get to know new people and practise your German.
- You prepare yourself for an apprenticeship or a job.
- They get a fixed daily structure.
- Avoid boredom and the negative consequences of unemployment.

Who can do these jobs?

Asylum seekers can do the work opportunities. You must fulfil the following requirements:

- They are fit for work, i.e. they can work.
- You no longer have to go to school.
- You have not yet retired.

Who offers work opportunities?

Work opportunities can be offered by state, municipal or non-profit organisations. These are, for example

- City of Augsburg
- associations
- social organisations such as Diakonie, Caritas, Red Cross and others.

These institutions can register jobs with the Office for Social Services, Senior Citizens and People with Disabilities (ASL). The ASL then assigns suitable people to these jobs. However, there is no entitlement to a specific job. The city decides on a case-by-case basis.

Which activities are eligible as non-profit work opportunities?

The work must be useful for the general public. In other words, it should help society and not serve to earn money.

Examples of such work.

- Landscape maintenance: removing weeds, clearing rubbish and leaves.
- Maintaining paths: Maintaining footpaths and cycle paths.
- Environmental and nature conservation: keeping streams and rivers clean.
- Garden maintenance: create and maintain flower meadows and orchards.

- Help in the building yard and recycling centre: Simple work in parks and green spaces.
- Making school and daycare centre grounds more beautiful: Assistance with small outdoor jobs.
- Social tasks: Supporting elderly people, language teaching for refugees.
- Maintaining sports and leisure facilities: Removing rubbish from playgrounds and sports fields.
- Help after natural disasters: Cleaning up after flooding or heavy snowfall.
- Clearing snow
- Workshop work: Repairing old bicycles or furniture
- Furniture transport

How many hours can you work?

There is no fixed rule, but:

- Work must not exceed 20 hours per week.
- It must not be a full-time job.
- One-off jobs are also possible.

Are asylum seekers insured while they are working?

- Work opportunities are not a real job, but a special type of employment. Therefore, there is no health, pension or unemployment insurance.
- However, in the event of an accident at work, people are covered by statutory accident insurance. If something happens, the accident is first reported to the ASL. The Bavarian Municipal Accident Insurance Fund (KUVB) then takes care of the next steps.

💡 The labour protection laws apply to the work opportunities. This means that there are rules on working hours, safety and protection in the workplace.

Who is liable if something breaks?

If someone damages something during work, special rules apply:

- In the case of intent (wilful intent) or gross negligence, the person must pay for the damage themselves.
- Minor damage is often covered by insurance.

Do I need a permit from the foreigners authority?

No. Permission from the immigration authority is not required for a work opportunity under the AsylbLG. There are no restrictions for refugees to take part in these jobs.

How much money do asylum seekers receive for their work?

- They receive a small allowance of 0.80 euros per hour.
- This money is paid in addition to social benefits and does not count as income.

- If you have additional travelling costs or other expenses, you can get them back.

💡 The money is paid by the Office for Social Benefits, Senior Citizens and People with Disabilities.

Do asylum seekers have to accept the work?

- The ASL first allocates the work opportunities to volunteers.
- The ASL can oblige some asylum seekers to take on work.
- If someone refuses or quits without good reason, this can lead to a reduction in social benefits.

What happens if cooperation does not work well?

If there are problems, the ASL, the institution and the person taking part talk to each other.

- The aim is to find a solution so that the person can continue working.
- If this does not work, a new job opportunity is sought.
- There are no notice periods - in other words, the job can be terminated or changed at any time.

What are the responsibilities and costs of the institution offering the work?

The organisations that offer work opportunities have certain tasks and costs.

- There must be people there to guide the asylum seeker.
The costs for this are borne by the institution itself. The Free State of Bavaria or the city pay nothing.
- If necessary, the institution must provide protective clothing (e.g. gloves or safety shoes).
- If a health certificate is required, the costs may be covered. You must discuss this with the ASL beforehand.¹²
- The institution must document working hours and send proof to the ASL every month.
- The institution must inform the ASL if
 - a person is ill
 - a person is absent without an excuse
 - a person refuses to work
 - an accident at work occurs

Payment card

What is a Bezahlkarte?

- The Bezahlkarte is like a bank card.
- Benefits according to Asylbewerberleistungsgesetz (AsylbLG) are transferred as credit to Bezahlkarte.
- You can use the Bezahlkarte to pay in shops and withdraw cash.
- You can only spend as much money as is on the card.

Who can get a Bezahlkarte?

- Anyone aged 14 and over who receives benefits under Asylbewerberleistungsgesetz (AsylbLG) can get an Bezahlkarte.
- In benefit communities (e.g. families), each family member aged 14 and over receives their own payment card.

Where do I get my Bezahlkarte?

If you receive benefits, you will receive a letter from Amt für Soziale Leistungen (ASL) .

- It will contain all the information and a date for collection.
- You don't need to do anything else to get your Bezahlkarte.
- If you are applying for benefits for the first time and these are approved, you will receive an from the outset. Bezahlkarte.

Which benefits go to Bezahlkarte?

- Benefits are paid into Bezahlkarte in accordance with Asylbewerberleistungsgesetz (AsylbLG).

💡 Do you receive other benefits (e.g. child benefit) or wages from an employer? Then you also need a current account.

How much money do I have on the card?

- The benefits are paid onto Bezahlkarte in accordance with Asylbewerberleistungsgesetz (AsylbLG) .
- You can check your balance online at meine.bezahlkarte.eu and in the payment card app.
- To do this, you need the Karten-ID and the

Where can I use Bezahlkarte?

- You can pay with Bezahlkarte in all shops that accept Mastercard.
💡 Look out for the orange/red Mastercard® sign.

Are there any regional restrictions?

You can only pay with Bezahlkarte in your authorised area.

- You can define this area online at meine.bezahlkarte.eu and in the payment card app.
- In some cases, Bezahlkarte is restricted to the city of Augsburg.
- In exceptional cases, payment may also be authorised at other locations (for example, if you need to visit your lawyer or an authority at another location).

💡 Please notify Amt für Soziale Leistungen (ASL) in advance by e-mail asylblg.soziales@augzburg.de or by telephone. You will find the telephone numbers in the letter from ASL.

Are there problems with certain transactions?

- Yes, certain transactions are not possible.
- For example, you cannot use Bezahlkarte for money transfer services such as Western Union or MoneyGram.
- The purchase of certain goods or services is not excluded.

Can I withdraw cash from Bezahlkarte?

- Yes, you can withdraw cash.
- Each person in your benefit community can withdraw up to €50 per month.
- You can withdraw cash free of charge from ATMs or at the till in many shops.
- Withdrawals are only possible twice a month.
- After that, the card is blocked for further withdrawals.

Can I transfer money with the Bezahlkarte?

- In certain cases, a bank transfer may be authorised.
- The recipient must first be authorised by Amt für Soziale Leistungen (ASL).
- This applies, for example, to invoices to your lawyer or payments to social department stores.

Can I pay by direct debit with Bezahlkarte?

- Yes, direct debit is permitted in certain cases.
- The recipient must first be authorised by Amt für Soziale Leistungen, Senioren (ASL).
- This applies, for example, to mobile phone contracts, public transport providers, WLAN vouchers and gym contracts or sports club membership fees.

Do I no longer need a current account?

- If you only receive benefits in accordance with Asylbewerberleistungsgesetz (AsylbLG), you do not need another account.
- If you receive other benefits (e.g. child benefit) or wages from an employer, you also need a current account.

I have lost my Bezahlkarte. What do I need to do?


- You can block your payment card online at meine.bezahlkarte.eu to block it.
- You can also block the card by telephone at [116116](tel:116116) to block it. This is possible in German or English.
- If you find the card again, you can reactivate it online at meine.bezahlkarte.eu to reactivate it.

Have you permanently lost your Bezahlkarte?


- Then you must report the loss or theft to Amt für Soziale Leistungen (ASL).
- The old card will be cancelled and you will receive a new one.
- The credit will be transferred to the new card.

Where can I get help?

- Online at meine.bezahlkarte.eu and in the payment card app there is a support chat. This is available in several languages.
- A telephone bot is also always available for you in over 100 languages.

Ukraine

The protection status of refugees from Ukraine

The protection status of refugees from Ukraine will be automatically extended until March 4, 2026

With the regulation amending the Ukraine Residence Permit Continuity Ordinance (1. UkraineAufenthÄndFGV), residence permits that are still valid from February 1, 2025 in accordance with Section 24 of the Residence Act, including their conditions and additional provisions, will be automatically extended until March 4, 2026.

This means that an appointment with the responsible department for migration and residence regarding an extension is not necessary.

Humanitarian residence permits extended

The war in Ukraine is still going on. The Council of the European Union has therefore extended the residence permits for refugees from Ukraine. The humanitarian residence permits are valid until 4 March 2025. These are residence permits in accordance with Section 24 (1) of the Residence Act, which are valid until 1 February 2024.

What does this mean in concrete terms?

- Is your residence permit valid on 1 February 2024? Then it is automatically extended until 4 March 2025.
- You do not need to apply for an extension. You do not need to go to the immigration office.
- You can continue to work, study and travel.
- You can receive social benefits.

 The Ukraine Residence Permit Continued Validity Ordinance does not apply to fictitious certificates. These must still be extended at the foreigners authority.

Citizen's Income

Here you will find the most important changes to the new Citizen's Income Act.

- As of 01.01.2023, the Citizen's Income Act (SGB II)) will replace the Basic Security for Jobseekers (SGB II). The changes come in two steps:

01.01.2023 and 01.07.2023.

- People who receive benefits under SGB II do not have to submit a new application for benefits.
- You can submit new applications via the online portal www.jobcenter.digital.
You can also upload documents here.

Innovations from 01.01.2023:

- Abolition of the priority of placement (i.e. placement in work is not in the foreground).
- In the Citizen's Income, further training and the acquisition of a vocational qualification are more important.
- The special regulation according to which older benefit recipients are no longer considered unemployed after 12 months of benefit receipt without an offer of employment is abolished.
- Up to a de minimis limit of 50 euros, clawbacks will be waived.

Innovations as of 01.07.2023:

- An independent conciliation mechanism will be created in the event of conflicts in connection with the creation or updating of a cooperation plan. Mediation can be requested by one or both sides.
- With the instrument § 16i SGB II, employment relationships subject to social security contributions can be supported with wage cost subsidies for up to five years.
- Employment coaching, further training and internships accompany the subsidised employment. The aim is to enable people who are particularly distant from the labour market to participate socially and gradually move closer to the general labour market.
- The abolition of Section 81 of Book II of the Social Code on 1 January 2023 as part of the Citizen's Income Act will remove the time limit on the provision of Section 16i of Book II of the Social Code and establish the instrument permanently.
- If intensive support is required, holistic support (coaching) can be used as a new offer in future.
- In the case of a one-off need for support in the case of high heating cost arrears, neither a waiting period nor correspondingly more favourable asset allowances apply.
- In these cases, by way of exception, until December 2023, an application can also be submitted after the month in which the heating cost arrears payment is due (at the latest, however, at the end of the third month).
