- Augsburg has more bridges than Venice. There are around 530 bridges here.
- Drinking water in Augsburg is of very good quality. It can also be used for baby food. There are 22 drinking water wells in the city.
- Almost a quarter of Augsburg's surface area is covered by forest.
- There are around 80,000 trees in the city.
- There are 14 public holidays in Augsburg. On 8 August, Augsburg residents also celebrate the High Peace Festival.
- Augsburg has 17 city districts.
- There are 70 public schools in Augsburg.
