

Things to know about the District of Cuxhaven

Location: Northernmost district of Lower Saxony. It borders the North Sea and lies between the river Elbe and the river Weser.

The District of Cuxhaven is the second largest district in Germany.

Ten communities and unified municipalities form the district:

The City of **Cuxhaven** and the town of **Geestland**, the unified municipalities of **Beverstedt**, **Hagen**, **Loxstedt**, **Schiffdorf** and **Wurster Nordseeküste** and the communities of **Börde**, **Lamstedt**, **Hemmoor** and **Land Hadeln**.

Today, the District of Cuxhaven is known for its proximity to the **Wadden Sea**, which attracts many tourists every year. On the coast you can see the **North Sea** and take a long walk on the dikes. The landscape is mainly flat and characterised by agriculture. Here you can find **peace and quiet**.

In the seaport, mainly fish and cars are shipped daily. This offers many **jobs**.

The district borders **Bremerhaven** and **Bremen** to the southwest and Stade to the east. From there it is not far to **Hamburg**.

There are also many **leisure activities**, **festivals** and a great deal of **voluntary work**.
