Swimming

Swimming rules in Germany

Do you feel like going swimming? No problem, there are several swimming pools in Dormagen that you can visit. You can also go swimming in a quarry pond in Dormagen-Straberg. We advise against swimming in the Rhine and some other lakes, as this can be life-threatening. Please always look out for prohibition signs!

There are a few rules to follow when swimming:

- 1. Only go swimming if you feel comfortable. Cool down and take a shower before going into the water.
- 2. Never go into the water with a full or empty stomach.
- 3. If you are not a swimmer, only enter the water up to your stomach.
- 4. Do not overestimate yourself or your strength.
- 5. Never call for help unless you are in real danger, but help others if they need it.
- 6. Do not swim where there are boats and ships.
- 7. Inflatable buoyancy aids do not offer you safety in the water.
- 8. Only jump into the water if it is free and deep enough.
- 9. Keep the water and its surroundings clean, throw rubbish in the rubbish bin.
- 10. During thunderstorms, swimming is life-threatening. Leave the water immediately and seek a permanent building.

Carnival and shooting clubs







Dormagen lies in the middle of the Rhineland and between the two German carnival strongholds of Düsseldorf and Cologne. No wonder that the people of Dormagen know how to celebrate carnival with abandon.

But what is carnival or what is it all about?

The festival is already several hundred years old, as we know it today, it has been celebrated since the middle of the 18th century. Some traditions date back to this time, which even many Dormagen residents can only partially understand. But important elements have remained until today. For example, people still put on costumes to slip into a different role. The office worker wears a smart aeroplane pilot's uniform, the bank manager becomes a clown, the nurse the Lion King. Mostly, "those up there" are taken for a ride - for example politicians, civil servants and also the military. This can often be seen in the theme floats of carnival societies.

Can I just join in the celebrations?

Yes! People in the Rhineland are quite open and curious, even towards strangers. Interaction is relaxed, but friendliness and respect are paramount. A smile from the other person shows whether he or she wants to party with you.

To the music, people hook up with the person next to them. This is called "swaying" in the language of the locals. If women hook up to sway, it only means that they want to celebrate, nothing more. Often this acquaintance only lasts for one song and then they continue celebrating and swaying in another group.

Do you have to drink alcohol to join in the celebrations?

Many people do drink beer or other alcoholic beverages at carnival, but of course this is not compulsory. You can have fun, sing and dance just as well without alcohol.

Schützenfest in Dormagen

A Schützenfest is a folk festival that derives from the regular meeting of Schützenbruderschaften or Schützenvereine. During the course of the festival, the best marksman (Schützenkönig) is usually determined in a shooting competition. Some local customs also determine the shooting king through other competitions, such as ring shooting, bird shooting, target shooting or shooting with bows and arrows.
