Interesting facts about the district of Emsland

The district of Emsland stretches over 2,880 square kilometres from Rheine to Papenburg. This makes it the largest district in Lower Saxony in terms of area. Emsland is one of the largest districts in Germany and is larger in total than the federal state of Saarland.

Emsland is around 95 kilometres long from north to south and 56 kilometres wide from east to west. It borders the Netherlands to the west. To the east it borders the districts of Cloppenburg and Osnabrück, and to the south-west it borders the district of Grafschaft Bentheim.

There are 19 different administrative units in Emsland, including towns, municipalities and joint municipalities. These administrative units vary greatly in size.

The district of Emsland offers all citizens good services in the areas of education, culture and shopping. Emsland is also a great place for cycling trips. There are many different routes that are well signposted so that you can cycle safely. Important offices

Employment Agency

The Federal Employment Agency is responsible for everything to do with employment. Are you looking for a job? Do you need help choosing a career? Would you like to have your qualifications recognised? Then contact the Employment Agency.

Is your asylum procedure still ongoing? Or are you tolerated? Then the Employment Agency is your point of contact. They will help you with questions about the transition between school and work (careers advice). They will place you in work. And they will advise you on further vocational training.

Contact us in Meppen, Lingen or Papenburg!

Are you recognised? Then the <u>job centre</u> is your point of contact. They will advise and place you in the labour market.

Job centre

The job centre pays financial benefits. It also places you in work and training. This depends on your individual needs. Among other things, the job centre will enable you to take part in a





<u>language course</u>. It will refer you to a careers counselling service. Or it can help you get your certificates <u>recognised</u>. Would you like to work? Then you will find information and advice here: <u>Access to the labour market</u>.

The employees of the Job Centre are not permitted to pass on any information about customers. Do you have a voluntary companion? Then you must give them a power of attorney. This must be completed in full and signed by both parties.

less your asylum application still pending? Or your application has been rejected? Then the Federal Employment Agency is responsible for matters relating to employment promotion.

Steps after a positive decision

You have received a positive decision from the BAMF. This means that the asylum procedure has been successfully completed.

Have you been recognised as entitled to asylum or have you been granted refugee protection? Then you can apply for a <u>citizen's allowance (job centre)</u>.

Case management

- You can find the contact details of your case manager<u>here</u>.
- Important: There is no counselling without an appointment.
- Have you already attended an <u>integration course</u>? Bring your certificate with you!
 Otherwise, take a look <u>here</u> to find out how you can take part in an integration course free of charge.
- Do you have documents about <u>school attendance</u> or <u>training</u>? Do you have job references? <u>Have</u> your <u>foreign qualifications been recognised</u>? Please bring these with you.
- Tell us about any special skills you have (e.g. crafts or language skills).
- Think about which area of work you are interested in before the appointment.

Immigration office

The authority regulates the residence of residents without German citizenship. Do you live in the town of Lingen? Then contact the Lingen Foreigners' Registration Office.

What you can do at this authority:





- Clarify questions about entry. This concerns, for example, family reunification. Or invitations to visit.
- Questions about residence after entry. For example, applying for a residence permit.
- Naturalisation

Please make an appointment before your visit. A spontaneous visit without an appointment is not possible!

Please only contact the Immigration Office by telephone or e-mail. You will then receive an appointment proposal.

Health department

The public health department is part of the healthcare system in Germany. For example, it is responsible for protecting the population from infectious diseases. Or it deals with hygiene in companies. These can be hospitals and care centres. Or restaurants and cafés. Would you like to work in a restaurant? Then you need an instruction on infection protection. The public health department also has other tasks. The health authority has a social psychiatric service and also a medical service. The medical service carries out assessments on request. The paediatric service carries out school entry examinations and provides information about illnesses. In general, it informs the population about health risks.

Equal Opportunities Officer

The Basic Law places men and women on an equal footing. Nevertheless, women and men often do not have equal rights in everyday life. The Equal Opportunities Officers in the district





of Emsland are people who want to ensure that women and men are treated equally. They work both inside and outside the local administrations.

Goals and tasks of equal opportunities work

- Equal opportunities for all genders in the family, at work and in society
- Elimination and prevention of gender-based discrimination
- Reduction of structural disadvantages for women

Residents' Registration Office

In principle, all people who come to Germany and wish to stay for longer than three months must register their residential address with the authorities after two weeks at the latest. Are you moving within Germany? Then you must inform the authorities of your new address.

This registration has nothing to do with registering as an asylum seeker or registering with the <u>immigration authorities</u>. You must do this in addition. You can find out how to register as a refugee in the chapter on <u>asylum and refugees</u>.

Who has to register and when?

All people who move to Germany or move within Germany must register or re-register at the Residents' Registration Office (often also called the Citizens' Registration Office or Citizens' Office). Registration within two weeks is mandatory. Are you registering too late or not at all? Then you may have to pay a fine.





When you register, you will receive an "official confirmation of registration". Keep this document in a safe place. You can use it to prove - even without your ID - that you are registered in a municipality or city in Germany. This means that you are resident there.

What do I need to bring with me to register?

You must register in person at the Residents' Registration Office or Citizens' Registration Office. You can find the address of your residents' registration office or citizens' registration office at the bottom of this page.

You must bring your ID (identity card, residence permit, residence document, etc.) with you when registering. Do you have a passport? Or passport replacement documents? Then bring these with you too. You must also fill in a registration form. You can obtain the form directly from the residents' registration office.

In some cities / municipalities, you will also need a so-called "landlord's confirmation of moving in" for the registration. This is a document in which your landlord or landlady confirms that you are renting his or her flat. Sometimes your birth certificate or marriage certificate is also required for registration. If you have these documents, bring them with you to the registration office as a precaution.

Address of the residents' registration office

Please contact the <u>local authority</u> in your place of residence.

Important: You will only find general information on this topic here. Please enquire about your personal situation at your local authority in your place of residence.

Registry office

The registry office has several tasks. Have you had a child? Then you must report the birth to the registry office. The registry office will then notarise the birth. Would you like to get married? Then the registry office will register your marriage.

The tasks at a glance

- · Notarising births and deaths
- Concluding marriages and partnerships
- · Receiving resignations from the church
- · Changing names
- Issuing certificates (birth certificate, death certificate, marriage certificate)
