SKV - Language and cultural mediators

Language and cultural mediators (in German: SKVs for short) are people with and without a migration background who translate during conversations as a neutral authority. They are subject to binding confidentiality and receive intercultural training from the City of Aschaffenburg for their work. The service is free of charge for all citizens of Aschaffenburg and institutions based in the city.

Flyer on language and cultural mediators (SKV) - multi-lingual

The language and cultural mediators can be requested by institutions (e.g. offices, schools, day-care centres, doctors' surgeries, etc.) or private individuals.

Private individuals can only request language and cultural mediators in person at the office hours of the integration management. **Office hours are on Mondays from 12-15.** Please bring proof of the date for which a language and cultural mediator is needed.

Requirements:

- You live in the Aschaffenburg city area.
- The event will take place in the City of Aschaffenburg.
- The request must be made at least 7 days before the respective appointment in the office hours on Mondays.

The Kulturpass offers discounts on monthly tickets for adults and on day tickets for children. The discounts only apply to buses within the City of Aschaffenburg.

On all Saturdays in the year, bus travel on VAB bus lines within the city area is free of charge.

Energy and electricity

Anyone who rents an apartment in Germany usually has to deal with the electricity provider themselves and ensure that the bill is paid. The choice of electricity provider is left to the tenant. The costs for gas are usually included in the so-called "warm rent" ("Warmmiete"), but there are exceptions.

For electricity, tenants pay an estimated amount once a month, which is also called a "Abschlag" (deduction).

Once a year, a review is conducted: How much electricity was used? If you use more electricity than you have already paid for with the instalments, you have to pay extra. If you use less, you get your money back.

In the case of electricity and gas, there is a free choice of supplier. For water, you have to use the local supplier.

Car-sharing

In collaboration with the association "Verkehrsclub Deutschland" the Aschaffenburg municipal utilities also offer car-sharing. Registration for car-sharing takes place once for interested parties via the VCD.

A personal user card is then issued. With this, the car sharing vehicles can be opened. The key is stored in the glove compartment of the car. The booking of a vehicle is done online.

The environment and waste disposal

Whether it concerns organic waste, waste paper, residual waste, scrap metal, waste glass, plastic, electronic waste – every day, a lot of waste, rubbish and recyclables accumulate in Aschaffenburg. Rubbish that cannot be disposed of in household waste is accepted by the two recycling centres in the wider Aschaffenburg region:

Stadtrat (City Council)

The City Council consists of the Lord Mayor and 44 City Council members, each elected for a term of six years. The City Council administers the city through its resolutions. The city council members do not hold a general political mandate, i.e. they are not parliamentarians. In accordance with the principle of representative democracy, they exercise a free mandate, are bound only by their conscience and are not bound by instructions.
