The aim is for you to feel at home in your new surroundings and to become part of our society.



### Interesting facts about Ingolstadt

Ingolstadt was first named in a document more than 1200 years ago. A document by Charlemagne mentions a "place of Ingold" at the mouth of the Schutter. Around 1250, the promotion became a town. From 1392 to 1447, it was the residential capital of the Duchy of Bavaria-Ingolstadt. The Bavarian Beer Purity Law was proclaimed here in 1516. And from 1472 to 1800, the city was home to the first Bavarian university in Old Bavaria.

Ingolstadt was a small town characterised by farming until the middle of the last century. But then industrialisation rapidly picked up speed and with it the population grew. Today, almost 140,000 people live in the second largest city in Upper Bavaria. Here you will find all the facilities of a modern regional centre. Ingolstadt has retained its old Bavarian charm. It boasts extensive green spaces and parks. In addition to several bathing lakes, there are also 2 indoor swimming pools and the Danube thermal baths.

Numerous historic buildings have been preserved in the old town centre. They reflect the city's eventful history to this day. Did you know that the family of the French Queen Isabeau resided in the New Palace? You know the stories of Dr Victor Frankenstein. He is said to have created his monster in the Old Anatomy. Why are the people of Ingolstadt also known as the "Schanzer"?

And it's not just the city that makes life here in the heart of Bavaria so attractive. Ingolstadt is surrounded by cultural landscapes and natural beauty:

### History:

- The first documentary mention dates back to 806.

- From 1827 to 1945, the city served as a fortress and garrison town.
- Ingolstadt has had a population of over 100,000 since 1989. This makes Ingolstadt the youngest city in Germany.


