Authorities and counselling

First points of contact

Asylum seekers

Asylum application and registration

Applying for asylum

Have you come to Germany to seek protection from persecution and other dangers in your home country?

- You can **apply for asylum** at the state initial reception centre in Bochum (*Gersteinring* <u>50, 44791 Bochum</u>).
- During your **asylum procedure**, you **will** live in centralised accommodation in the state.
- After completion of the asylum procedure or a certain time after the rejection, you will be **allocated** a **city** in which you can or must live.

 \bigcirc If you need a train ticket to travel to the state reception centre in Bochum, you can contact the police (for example \heartsuit <u>Hansastraße 25, 47799 Krefeld</u>) or the foreigners authority (\heartsuit <u>Am</u> <u>Hauptbahnhof 5, 47798 Krefeld</u>).

Only a few people can apply for asylum outside of a central centre. These include **minors** who have come to Germany unaccompanied by their parents.

have come to Germany. In this case, you will be assigned a guardian who will look after you.

 \Im If you are under the age of 18 and unaccompanied by your parents, please register with the police or the immigration office.

Registration

If you have already been assigned to the city of Krefeld, the Foreigners' Registration <u>Office</u> (\mathbf{Q} <u>Am Hauptbahnhof 5, 47798 Krefeld</u>) is your most important local contact for your legal residence matters. There

- Your permit/tolerated stay will be extended,
- a decision will be made about a work permit,
- It will be discussed whether it is necessary to leave the country under certain conditions.

You must always make an appointment for an appointment.

Further steps

You will receive support for the next steps at various points:

• Accommodation : Once you have registered, the immigration office will also allocate you a place to live.





- **Financial support:** If you are in need of assistance, you can apply for asylum seeker benefits from the <u>Central Department</u>.
- **School:** If you have children between the ages of six and 18, you can obtain a school place through the <u>Integration Department</u>'s lateral entry counselling service.
- Learning German: You can find all information on the subject of language here.

Further support

- **Social worker:** A social worker from the city of Krefeld will contact you in the next few days to help you with any questions you may have.
- **Counselling** : Information on free counselling centres can be found <u>here</u>.
- Contact person in everyday life: Information on volunteer support can be found here.

Chancen-Aufenthaltsrecht (§104c Aufenthaltsgesetz)

The right of residence (§104c) is intended to give people who have been living in Germany for years, are well integrated and have a tolerated stay permit the prospect of staying.

Do you need support to apply for a residence permit in accordance with Section 104c of the Residence Act?

Or do you already have a residence permit in accordance with Section 104 of the Residence Act and need further support? For example, are you looking for a German course or a job? Or do you need to apply for a passport?

EU citizens

Registration

If you are a citizen of the EU and want to live in Germany, you do not need a residence permit to stay in Germany. As an EU citizen, you enjoy freedom of movement throughout Germany and can live, work and reside wherever you want. However, you must **register** your place of residence **with the** <u>Foreigners' Registration Office</u>.





All information on this and a link to the online appointment system can be found <u>here</u>.

Under the link you will also find the submission of a **landlord's certificate**. You will need this certificate from your landlord confirming that you have actually moved into the flat in order to register.

 \mathcal{P} Your right to freedom of movement may be lost if you claim excessive social benefits or commit criminal offences. In this case, you can contact the immigration authorities.

Further steps

Third-country nationals

Registration

Have you come to Germany to study, work or live with your family? You probably already have a visa and the Foreigners' Registration Office is already familiar with your case.

Visa: Regardless of whether you arrived with or without a visa, you must apply for a residence permit immediately. This document allows you to stay in Germany for longer. The residence permit is issued by the <u>Foreigners</u> ' Registration Office. You must apply for the document while your visa is still valid.

 Application: If you already have a residence permit and have moved to Krefeld, you only need to register your place of residence. You can make an appointment <u>here</u>. There you can also download the form for the landlord's certificate of residence, which is required for registration.





 $\label{eq:product}$ If you would like to move to Krefeld, but are only allowed to live in the city of your previous place of residence (**"residence requirement")**, you must first apply for a change of decision at your previous foreigners authority.

Important offices

Migration Department (Foreigners' Registration Office)

What are the functions of a foreigners authority?

To stay in Germany for a longer period of time, you need a special "permit". There are different types, such as a visa, a residence permit, an EU Blue Card, a settlement permit or a permanent residence permit. These are all residence permits. If you have one of these, you are allowed to stay in Germany as a foreigner.

After your arrival in Germany, you should report to the Foreigners' Registration Office. In Krefeld, the foreigners authority is called the "Migration Department". You can apply for a residence permit there. This title is also called an electronic residence permit. <u>Here</u> you <u>will</u> find information on how to apply for your electronic residence permit.

What else you can do at the Immigration Office:

- You can extend your proof of arrival.

- The foreigners authority will give you permission to stay here and extend it. This is also known as a residence permit.

- You can apply for a work permit.

- You can register and deregister your place of residence. If you move house, for example, you will receive a new registration certificate. This is a document that tells you where you are registered.





- You will receive a residence permit and an exemption authorisation for travel.

The Migration Department

If you do not have German citizenship, the Migration Department in Krefeld is often the first authority you come into contact with. The Migration Department helps people who come from other countries and want to live in Germany. It takes on the tasks of the Foreigners' Registration Office, the Naturalisation Office and the Residents' Registration Office for foreign nationals.

The Migration Department has various departments that work together.

The **front office** is the first place you can get help. There you can:

- Order and collect residence permits
- Submit declarations to invite family members from abroad
- make appointments, for example to register your residence. Further information and appointments for residence registration can be <u>found here</u>.

You can still register your place of residence by appointment. Since March 2024, it has also been possible to **register your place of residence without an appointment**. **Consultation hours without an appointment** have been introduced for this purpose. These are the times when you can come:

Monday: 08:30 to 12:00, 14:00 to 15:30 Tuesday: 08:30 to 12:00 Thursday: 08:30 to 12:00, 14:00 to 17:00 Friday: 08:30 am to 12:00 pm

The Asylum and Refugee Affairs Department is responsible for

- The extension of your permit
- Deciding on applications for work permits
- Issuing a residence permit if your asylum application was successful
- If your asylum application has been rejected, the staff will discuss with you the possibility of leaving the country or check whether there are grounds for a tolerated stay.

The following issues are decided in the area of residence and naturalisation :

- The granting of visas for entry
- Temporary and permanent residence permits
- Naturalisation.

In the **area of return management**, decisions are made on the deportation of people who have, for example, committed serious criminal offences.

Citizen service

The Citizens' Services Department of the City of Krefeld offers many services for the citizens of Krefeld. These include, for example

- Registration and re-registration in Krefeld
- Identity card matters
- notarisations
- Applying for a certificate of good conduct
- Registration matters after the birth of your child
- Marriage matters
- Change of address on documents
- Registration certificate
- Registration information
- Change of name
- Parking concessions for special groups
- Applying for a disabled person's pass
- Death matters
- Elections and voting

 \mathcal{Q} If you have recently moved to Krefeld, you must register with this office within two weeks:

- People from a third country or from an EU country must register their move with the <u>Foreigners' Registration Office</u>.
- All others must register their move with a citizens' <u>office</u>. These citizens' offices are located in Krefeld Mitte, Bockum, Fischeln, Hüls, Traar and Uerdingen.

Registry office

The registry office has several tasks. These are, for example





- Notarisation of births
- marriages
- Issuing certificates
- Notarisation of deaths

Births

A birth certificate is the most important document for a newborn child and for you as parents. Only when your child has a birth certificate will you receive child benefit from the state and be able to apply for health insurance.

The hospital is responsible for informing the registry office of the birth of a new child. They will need the following original documents:

- Birth certificates of the parents
- Marriage certificate of the parents
- National passports of the parents

<u>Be sure to</u> bring these documents with you to the hospital for the birth. You will receive your documents back in the post after a few days.

♀ If the father or mother was not born in the EU, you must have your birth certificates and marriage certificates notarised and translated. Your child cannot be registered at the registry office before this. Sometimes it takes several months before you receive the certificates. You should therefore contact your registry office @geburten@krefeld.de as soon as you find out about your pregnancy. They will tell you which documents you need to apply for.

Marriage

If you wish to get married, you must register <u>this</u> in writing at the registry office. If you would like to know which documents you need for the wedding, you can enquire <u>here</u>.

Economic aid in accordance with AsylbLG

You are entitled to economic aid in accordance with the Asylum Applicants Benefits Act (AsylbLG) if you are in need of help and have

- a temporary residence permit (Aufenthaltsgestattung)
- exceptional leave to remain (Duldung)
- a residence permit (Aufenthaltserlaubnis) under international law or on humanitarian grounds





In this case the state will pay you benefits for

- living costs (food, clothes, accommodation)
- treatment for illness, pregnancy and childbirth
- other situations (meeting the special needs of children, for example)

 $\label{eq:second}$ If you are no longer entitled to benefits in accordance with AsylbLG, for example because you are a recognised asylum seeker, you will receive benefits from other welfare providers (such as the <u>lob Centre</u> or <u>Basic Income (Grundsicherung)</u>).

Please make an <u>appointment</u> with your advisor. As well as <u>all identity papers</u>, please bring the following documents with you:

- proof of immigration status (e.g. residence permit)
- documents regarding personal and economic circumstances

Integration department

The Integration department offers a wide range of services for people from other countries and for better coexistence.

A social worker in Krefeld is available for people who have a history of flight. This person will contact you soon and visit you in person. You will have the opportunity to discuss any important questions that have arisen in your new life situation in Krefeld.

The following services offered by the Integration Department for new immigrants are of particular interest:

Counselling

If you are looking for advice on integration issues (e.g. recognition, further training, labour market, other hurdles), you can contact the case managers of the <u>Municipal Integration</u> <u>Management (KIM)</u>. They will help you with your questions.

School enrolment

If you have school-age children and would like to register them for school, you do not have to take care of this on your own. You can arrange a counselling appointment <u>here</u>. The staff will make sure that a school place is found for your children.

Holiday language courses

During the holidays, your children can take part in <u>Holiday Intensive Training - FIT in German</u>. Here they can improve their German language skills in a fun way, play with other children and get to know the city of Krefeld better.

Volunteer interpreters



If you need support for an official appointment because you still have problems with the German language, you can ask for a <u>volunteer interpreter</u>. Volunteer interpreters are people who accompany you to your appointment free of charge and help you to understand the information in the conversation. You can ask where you have the appointment if someone can be there to help you translate.

Family pilots

The family guides support migrant parents with their children, especially when the children are still small. The parents are supported in everyday life with their children. The children are thus encouraged in their abilities and have a better chance of a good education.

The programme is primarily aimed at parents who are still living in collective accommodation.

Integration guides

Young volunteers between the ages of 17 and 25 have the opportunity to meet up with an immigrant of the same age and discover the city together. You can spend your free time together, do sports and talk to each other over a cup of tea or coffee. Employment Agency

The <u>Federal Employment Agency</u> is responsible for everything to do with employment. If you are looking for a job, need help choosing a career in Germany, need your qualifications recognised or similar, the Employment Agency is your point of contact. In some cases, the employment agency will also cover the costs of job application training, a skills assessment (what can I do and how much is this in demand from employers?) or the provision of professional skills (including language courses). Talk to your responsible case worker about this.

The Employment Agency is responsible for you in the following cases:

- If your asylum procedure is still ongoing (Aufenthaltsgestattung)
- If you have a tolerated stay permit
- If you have been recognised and have been employed for at least one year subject to social insurance contributions.

Are you recognised but have not been in employment subject to social security contributions for the last twelve months? Then the job centre is your point of contact.

Job centre

This <u>lobcenter</u> is responsible for you if you:

- 1) have a secure residence status and
- 2) you are unemployed or

3) your income is very low and not enough to live on.

The job centre supports you financially, helps you to find work and finances qualifications for you. For example, it will enable you to take part in a language course, arrange career counselling or have certificates recognised. Further information can be found in the chapter on <u>access to the labour market</u>.

Job Centre staff are not permitted to pass on any information about their customers. If another person is to contact the Job Centre on your behalf, this person will always need a power of attorney that you sign.

♀ If you have a residence permit (asylum procedure is still ongoing) or a tolerated stay permit (asylum procedure has been legally rejected), the job centre is not responsible for your search for a job and qualification. Steps after a positive decision on the asylum procedure

Have you been recognised as entitled to asylum or have you been granted refugee protection? Then these are your next steps:

1. personal interview

- You can apply to the job centre for basic benefits in accordance with SGB II.
- Your education and professional experience will be recorded.
- Two appointments will be arranged:
 - A counselling appointment with the <u>benefits department.</u>
 - An appointment with the job centre.

2. benefits department

Would you like to apply for benefits in accordance with SGB II? You can do this in person, in writing, by telephone or online.





Once we have received your application, the Jobcentre's customer centre will contact you by telephone to ask for initial relevant information and advise you.

3. job centre

 $\ensuremath{\mathbb{Q}}$ There is no counselling without an appointment

The job centre will support you in your search for qualifications and work.

- Please bring the following documents with you if you have them:
 - Obligation to attend an integration course or confirmation of participation in an integration course.
 - Documents relating to school attendance, training, job references, recognition of qualifications, etc.
- Tell us what skills (trade, language skills, etc.) you have.
- Before the interview, think about what kind of work would be suitable for you in Germany.

The "Jobcenter-App" starts on 14 January

On 14 January 2025, "Jobcenter-App" will be launched and can be downloaded from the app stores.

The app offers you many advantages.

From 14 January 2025, you can use the app to

- submit an application
- Upload documents
- communicate changes
- send messages via the mailbox service.

Department of Social Affairs and Senior Citizens

Help in many life situations: Social affairs and senior citizens

The Department of Social Affairs and Senior Citizens of the City of Krefeld helps people in many life situations - especially if you need support or certain documents. This includes, for example

- **Social assistance**: money for people who do not have enough to live on.
- Education and participation: Help for children and young people from families with little money.
- Krefeld Pass: discounted offers for people on low incomes.
- **ID card for people with severe disabilities (Schwerbehindertenausweis**): Proof for people with a disability.
- Care counselling and assistance for the elderly: Support with questions about care.

Package for education and participation (BuT)

The package for education and participation (BuT) helps children, teenagers and young adults from families with little money.

You can receive this support if you:

- Citizen's allowance (SGB II),
- social assistance (SGB XII),
- housing benefit,
- child supplement or
- receivebenefits under the Asylum Seekers Act.

The BuT package helps with

- Day trips to school or kindergarten
- School trips with overnight stays
- School materials such as satchels or pens
- Travel costs to school
- tutoring
- Lunch at school or day care centre
- Sports club, music school or other leisure activities

Krefeld Pass

With the Krefeld Pass, you pay less for admission to cultural and sporting facilities in the city of Krefeld.

The following people can apply for the pass free of charge at all Krefeld municipal offices :

- Recipients of citizen's allowance, social assistance, asylum seeker benefits or housing benefit.
- Young unemployed people under the age of 21.
- Children and young people in Krefeld children's homes if they receive assistance in accordance with the German Child and Youth Welfare Act (SGB VIII, i.e. the German Social Code).





The Krefeld Pass is valid for one year and can be extended once.

Severely disabled passes

People with a severe disability often have a hard time in everyday life. They have to spend more money on medication, a car without obstacles (a so-called "barrier-free" car) or on care.

The **severely disabled person's pass** is designed to **make life easier** for people with a degree of disability of 50 or more.

For example, the card protects you from being dismissed from your job and gives you more holiday days. You can also receive tax reductions and have to pay less for tickets for museums, swimming pools, buses or trains.

Care counselling and assistance for the elderly - Care support centre NRW

Here, people in need of care and their relatives can find information and advice on all aspects of care. The staff at the advice centre advise and help with applications and provide information on health insurance and long-term care insurance benefits and state social benefits. They offer advice and support in the search for and selection of services and care provision and organise individual care that meets needs and requirements.

In addition, information is offered on health care proxies, living wills and guardianship law. The advice centre has contacts with the providers of outpatient, semi-residential and inpatient care and support services in Krefeld and provides up-to-date overviews of the services on offer.

On request, the staff will support people in their search for a place in a care home.

Here you can obtain information on all aspects of care and are supported in applying for state benefits. The advice centre knows what is currently available if you need outpatient, semi-residential or inpatient care and support.

Housing counselling for older people and people with disabilities

Youth welfare office

Children's rights (best interests of the child) must be observed when bringing up children and young people. You can find out more about this in the chapter Living together in Germany. The Youth Welfare Office helps parents and other legal guardians to bring up children and young people. Anyone can contact the Youth Welfare Office free of charge, including children and young people if they have problems. Don't worry: the discussions are treated confidentially.

The Youth Welfare Office is responsible for





- supporting young people in their individual and social development
- · counselling and supporting parents in matters relating to parenting
- the protection of children and young people
- · creating positive living conditions for young people and families
- the prevention and reduction of disadvantages

When your child is born, the youth welfare office will contact you after a few weeks to make a home visit and introduce themselves. You will then receive a folder with information and services for your child and your family. You must register your child at the registry office in the first few days after the birth. You can find more information about this <u>here</u>.

The Youth Welfare Office is also responsible for unaccompanied foreign minors. In these cases, it works together with various organisations that offer, for example, accommodation and care and assume guardianship for the young people.

Advice centres

Migration counselling for adult immigrants (27 years and older)

The **Migration Counselling Service** supports everyone with an international family background aged 27 and older with

- a permanent residence permit (Aufenthaltstitel) in Germany.
- a mobility permit (Freizügigkeitserlaubnis).
- a right to stay (Bleiberecht, for recognised refugees).

These centres provide free advice. There is help, support, information and education available on the following topics:

- Authorities, for example, explaining notices/procedures
- Topics specific to foreigners, such as right to residence and work permit
- Financial support; help with applications
- Integration courses/language courses (German)
- Recognition of foreign school-leaving qualifications or university degrees (orientation counselling/initial counselling)





- Education systems and social security systems (information and education)
- Living and working in Germany
- Reuniting children, spouses and families
- Advice on psychosocial issues
- Limited range of services for language learning and day-to-day guidance

Form help



The language used by authorities is often difficult to understand. It is particularly important for new immigrants who do not know German or the official language used in letters and forms to have help when filling them out. Incorrect information or a wrong cross can quickly lead to problems.

You can get free support at various locations in Krefeld to help you understand letters and fill out forms and applications. You can get help with enrolments for private tuition and courses or if you need to contact nurseries, schools or authorities.

Do you already understand some of the fields on a form (e.g. surname, first name, street, house number)? Then fill in these fields. The people at the form help centre can check this so that no errors remain on the form.

 \bigcirc Did you know that some forms are already officially available in several languages? The application for child benefit is an example (<u>Kindergeld</u>). You can find more translated forms <u>here</u>.

Voluntary support

Support groups
