Integration Committee election 2025

What is the 2025 Integration Committee election?

Date of the election:

The next election will take place on 14 September 2025 parallel to the local elections in Krefeld.

Who can vote?

All persons who are at least 16 years old on election day and fulfil one of the following conditions are eligible to vote

- · are a foreign national,
- · have been naturalised in the course of their lives, or
- · have at least one foreign parent.

In addition, you must have been legally resident in Germany for at least one year and have been registered in Krefeld for at least 16 days before the election.

Who can stand as a candidate?

According to the regulations, all eligible voters who are at least 18 years old, have been legally resident in Germany for at least one year and have lived in Krefeld for at least three months before the election may stand as a candidate. People who are involved in voluntary or professional work for migrants often apply. Candidacy is possible as an individual or as part of a voter group or list.

Application deadline:

Applications must be submitted by Monday, 7 July 2025 at the latest. Time for this: 18:00.

Postal voting for the election:

The postal voting office opens in the Seidenweberhaus (Theaterplatz 1) on 11 August 2025. Opening hours:

Monday to Wednesday: 08:00-16:00

Thursday: 08:00-17:30 Friday: 08:00-12:30

Postal voting documents can be requested via:

- · QR code on the election notification,
- online form (at wahlen.krzn.de),
- · by post, or
- e-mail (with name, date of birth and address)

What is the Integration Committee for?

It currently consists of 11 members elected by migrants and 9 representatives of the city council. The committee mainly acts in an advisory capacity, but can also forward its own topics or proposals to the city council.

Delay in delivery of eAT - Delay in the delivery of electronic residence permits from Bundesdruckerei

The Krefeld Foreigners' Registration Office is currently waiting for the delivery of a large number of electronic residence permits (eATs). The reason is said to be an upcoming quality control by the Bundesdruckerei.

Essentially, all eATs ordered since 08.04.2025 are affected. A statement on the delivery date or production cannot be made at this time.

We therefore ask for your indulgence and understanding that we cannot answer questions about the delivery date with any certainty.

Introduction of digital photographs for eATs and passports

Important change from 01.05.2025

Only **digital biometric photos** may be used for residence permits and passports.

- We can no longer accept your own photos.
- Photos from mobile phones are also not permitted.

How to get a valid photo:

- From a photo service provider that is registered with a certified cloud service.
- Directly from us at the Service Centre of the Krefeld Foreigners' Registration Office. We can take your photo there for a fee of €6.00.

27.06.2024, Renewals in naturalisation law

Amendment to the law on naturalisation

From 27.06.2024, the new law on naturalisation will apply. If you would like to be naturalised there are important changes.

The most important changes are:

Previously, you had to have lived in Germany for at least eight years with a residence permit. Now you can be naturalised after just five years. If you already speak German very well and do very good work, this can even happen after just three years. However, it is now even more important that you work and do not receive welfare benefits. There are only a few exceptions to this rule. There are special regulations for guest workers from the past. In certain cases, guest workers do not have to speak German so well. Feel free to ask us. If you are older, ill or disabled and therefore do not speak German very well, there may be exceptions.





For naturalisation, it is even more clearly required that the person shares Germany's most important values. There is no place for racism and contempt for humanity in Germany. Naturalisation is then also ruled out. This also means that the special significance of the relationship with Israel and Jewish life is part of the naturalisation process.

You no longer have to give up your citizenship. Germany has decided that every person may have several nationalities. You can also naturalise in another country. You will then retain your German citizenship.

Improving residence registration: Successful first month and planned enhancements

We are pleased to inform you that we have successfully tested the first month of "walk-in customers" in the area of residence registration. Compared to the previous months (analysed retroactively until 09/2023), we were able to register an average of 33% more people in February.

To make the process even more efficient, we have introduced consultation hours without appointments.

Laws explained in more detail

The following chapters provide answers to frequently asked questions. We hope that this will alleviate some of your worries and make communication with the authorities and your everyday life easier. New information is regularly published here that may be useful for many users of the app.

Public transport

Deutschland-Ticket Social

With the Deutschland-Ticket Sozial, you can use many means of transport throughout Germany from December 2023 for 39 euros per month.

With the Deutschland-Ticket Sozial, you can travel on all local public transport. This includes buses, trams, underground and suburban trains and regional trains. The ticket is not valid for long-distance transport such as ICE, IC or EC.

The ticket is only available as a subscription, which can be cancelled monthly. It can be purchased online, via the app or directly at the GSAK ServiceCentre at Ostwall 148.

People who receive benefits can apply for the Deutschlandticket Sozial. Benefits include, for example, unemployment benefit II and social benefit (SGB II), housing benefit or benefits under the Asylum Seekers Benefits Act.

If you would like to know whether you are entitled to the DeutschlandTicket Sozial, you can contact a local authority directly, e.g. the Jobcentre <u>Bestellschein DeutschlandTicket Sozial.pdf</u> (vrr.de). There you will also receive a certificate of eligibility, also known as a carrier card. You also need this for the Deutschlandticket Sozial.

To apply for the ticket, you will need the carrier card from the job centre, an ID with your address and your bank card. If you have a joint account with your spouse, both of you must sign the contract. The amount of 39 will then be automatically debited from the account each month. You don't have to worry about anything else.

However, the ticket only belongs to the person who applied for it. You cannot take anyone else with you on the Deutschlandticket Sozial. The ticket is only valid for you.





The validity of the entitlement card from the Job Centre is always valid for as long as it is stated in the grant notice. If the period expires, you must apply for a new card from the Job Centre. You can do this either by post or directly via the BA Mobil app. You can also convert existing tickets into a Deutschlandticket Sozial.
