Interesting facts about the district of Soest

The district of Soest was created from the districts of Lippstadt and Soest and the Warstein office of the Arnsberg district with the municipal reorganisation in 1975. With over 300,000 inhabitants, its total area makes it the fourth largest district in North Rhine-Westphalia. Approximately 74,000 people in the district have a migration background, which corresponds to around 1/4 of the population. The district of Soest is one of the largest rural districts in the country with a considerable infrastructure. There are two official car licence plates. LP (stands for Lippstadt) and SO (Soest).

The traditional Hellweg runs through the centre of the district. In terms of landscape, the district is characterised by a great variety between the Münsterland parkland and the beginning Sauerland. The region also has a lot to offer tourists. Wonderful hiking trails, cycle paths and bridleways lead through unspoilt nature. Water sports of all kinds are possible on the lakes and rivers. The region can also be explored from the air.

The 14 towns and municipalities in the district offer a high quality of life for every generation. Culture and history can be found everywhere. The district of Soest has proven to be a dynamic growth region in terms of turnover, production and exports. A solid economic structure and good transport connections support this development.

The district of Soest is part of local self-government with the district council and the district administration. In addition to the direct responsibilities of the 14 towns and municipalities, it sees itself as their partner. The district administration is based in the town of Soest. The district administrator is the representative of the district of Soest. She is directly elected by the citizens. As a full-time district administrator, she heads the district administration and represents the district of Soest. She also heads the district police authority on behalf of the state of NRW.



Social welfare office

The social welfare office is responsible for providing social assistance. This includes the following benefits:

- · Basic security in old age and in the event of reduced earning capacity
- Care assistance
- Assistance with living expenses
- · Integration assistance for disabled people
- Assistance to overcome particular social difficulties
- Assistance with health
- Assistance in other life situations

The Social Welfare Office will advise and support you in all matters relating to these topics.





The social welfare office will ask you about your financial circumstances. You will therefore have to show whether you have any valuables such as jewellery or money. You will sign some documents and declarations. Please bring all your papers with you. All persons who are registered on your residence permit must accompany you to the appointment.

You will also receive the cheque for your living expenses here. You can exchange the cheque for cash (euros) at the bank. Please note that this money must last until your next appointment with the social welfare office (approx. 1 month). You will not receive any money until your next appointment with the Social Welfare Office.

The Social Welfare Office is your contact for the following issues:

- · Vouchers for initial baby equipment and for your child's school supplies
- · Money for train tickets to interview appointments
- · Sickness certificates, authorisation for operations and other medical measures
- · Education and participation package (BUT)
- · Activity and employment programme
- · Applications for redistribution, exemption from compulsory housing

Registry office

The registry office has many tasks. You will need to contact the registry office in many situations in your life. For example, after the birth of a child, for a marriage or in the event of a death.

Here you can see other tasks:

- · Notarisation of births and deaths
- Marriages and civil partnerships
- · Acceptance of church resignations
- Name changes

Residents' Registration Office

In principle, all people who come to Germany and wish to stay for longer than three months must register their residential address with the authorities after two weeks at the latest. Are you moving within Germany? Then you must inform the authorities of your new address.

This registration has nothing to do with registering as an asylum seeker or registering with the <u>immigration authorities</u>. You must do this in addition. You can find out how to register as a refugee in the chapter on <u>asylum and refugees</u>.

Who has to register and when?

All people who move to Germany or move within Germany must register or re-register at the Residents' Registration Office (often also called the Citizens' Registration Office or Citizens' Office). Registration within two weeks is mandatory. Are you registering too late or not at all? Then you may have to pay a fine.

When you register, you will receive an "official confirmation of registration". Keep this document in a safe place. You can use it to prove - even without your ID - that you are registered in a municipality or city in Germany. This means that you are resident there.

What do I need to bring with me to register?

You must register in person at the Residents' Registration Office or Citizens' Registration Office. You can find the address of your residents' registration office or citizens' registration office at the bottom of this page.

You must bring your ID (identity card, residence permit, residence document, etc.) with you when registering. Do you have a passport? Or passport replacement documents? Then bring these with you too. You must also fill in a registration form. You can obtain the form directly from the residents' registration office.

In some cities / municipalities, you will also need a so-called "landlord's confirmation of moving in" for the registration. This is a document in which your landlord or landlady confirms that you are renting his or her flat. Sometimes your birth certificate or marriage certificate is





also required for registration. If you have these documents, bring them with you to the registration office as a precaution.

Immigration office

Youth welfare office

Children's rights are important. Every child deserves to be respected and loved. Do you have a child? Then bring it up in accordance with children's rights. This is important for the well-being of your child. You can find out more in the chapter on children's rights.

The Youth Welfare Office supports parents in bringing up children and young people. Anyone can contact the Youth Welfare Office free of charge. Are you a child or young person? Do you have problems? Then you can contact the Youth Welfare Office.

Responsibilities of the Youth Welfare Office:

- · Supporting young people in their individual and social development
- · Advise and support parents in their upbringing
- · Protecting children and young people
- · Creating positive conditions for young people and families
- · Avoiding and breaking down barriers

Have you had a child? Then the youth welfare office contacts you after a few weeks. You would like a home visit. You can get to know the Youth Welfare Office. You will then receive a whole folder with information and offers. These are important for your child and your family.

Unaccompanied minor refugees are also subject to youth welfare law. This means that the case goes to the youth welfare office.

The towns of Lippstadt, Soest and Warstein have their own youth welfare office. The youth welfare office of the district of Soest is responsible for residents from the other municipalities.
