10. What is volunteering?

Many people who support refugees do so **voluntarily**. Often alongside official work, family and other commitments. In other words, they get **no money** for their work. The help they offer is **voluntary.** Please take this into account if the volunteer does not have time. That is why it is important to behave respectfully.

On the other hand, you also have to say if something is too much for you or if you want to do something on your own to learn to stand on your own two feet in Germany. Each person should respect the other and speak up if something is causing problems.

If you want to help others, you can also volunteer.

Anyone who wants to can volunteer. Also, in **sports clubs, cultural associations and mosque communities** most people work voluntarily.

Check with your city to find out how and when you can help.

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




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Parent and pupil guides

How can parents be supported?

Parents are an important partner in the choice of career for children. If parents are not able to fully accompany their children from school to work due to linguistic, cultural or other obstacles, the parent guides offer a good support option.

Parent guides are active in the following areas:

- Accompaniment to school events (evaluation talks on student potential analysis, parents' evenings, parents' cafés, parents' consultation days, individual counselling talks, development talks)
- Information about the education system and the routes to completing schooling
- Procurement of contacts and accompaniment to Advice Centres
- Translations for language barriers

The support offered by the parent guides is **free of charge for parents**.

How can pupils be supported?

The challenges of young people on their way from school to work can be varied. Pupil guides can help to overcome one or the other hurdle a little more easily.

Pupil chaperones are active in the following areas:

 Accompaniment to school events (evaluation talks for student potential analysis, individual counselling talks, development talks)





- Support in the search for internships or apprenticeships
- Support with applications
- Information about subsequent educational routes at the end of school
- Procurement of contacts and accompaniment to Advice Centres
- Translations for language barriers

The support offered by the student guides is **free of charge for students**.
