

Pregnancy and childbirth

Expecting mothers are subject to special protection in Germany and are entitled to advice, medical care and support with new acquisitions for the child. If you are pregnant, please consult a doctor first and have them carry out screenings. You will then receive a maternity passport (Mutterpass), which identifies you as an expectant mother and also contains important information about your health and the health of your child. Please always carry the Mutterpass with you in case of emergencies. Notify your municipal administration about the upcoming birth. They will check whether there is enough space for the child and will order baby goods.

The birth of a child is a special event in the lives of new parents – an event that brings both joy and uncertainty. When you become a parent, you will encounter new, unfamiliar, stressful and sometimes difficult situations. Parents who need or want to access professional advice, guidance and support in this new phase of life can take advantage of the family advisory services provided by the pregnancy advice service in the district.

Pregnancy advice centres

Pregnant women and expectant parents have the legal right to access advice on any question concerning pregnancy. These might be issues like potential solutions for psychological/social conflicts relating to a pregnancy, social and economic assistance, and family support services and assistance. Advice is available during pregnancy and up to the third month after childbirth. The child's right to education is limited to one year of age.



Medical check-ups for your child starting from day one:

Medical check-ups screen for any existing diseases or developmental delays the baby might have, making it possible to treat them at an early stage. Your child's physical and mental development will be monitored continuously. During every examination, the physician will give you comprehensive information, remind you of immunisation appointments and offer tips on what you should keep in mind in the coming weeks and months. The Zentrum für Kindervorsorge Homburg [Homburg Centre for Child Insurance] will invite you to the medical check-ups on behalf of the regional authorities. This is also where your doctor will send verification that your child has had the medical check-ups. For this reason, please always bring your response form [Rückmeldebogen] to these appointments. The insurance provider will cover the costs. If you do not have health insurance, the state will cover the costs. If this is the case, you should get in contact with your physician or the Department of Health [Gesundheitsamt]. What do midwives do?

Midwives advise, guide and support mothers and new-borns during pregnancy, birth, postpartum recovery and nursing. Midwives can help any woman who is pregnant, in childbirth or has just given birth. This assistance includes:

- · Advice and information
- · Prenatal care
- Support/assistance with pregnancy complications and premonitory pains
- · Preparation for giving birth
- Assistance during the birth
- Services after the mother has given birth (postpartum recovery support)
- · Postnatal exercise

 \mathbb{Q} Every pregnant woman can contact the midwife directly. The insurance provider will cover the costs.

Initial equipment

Show your Mutterpass to the Social Security Office and they will give you a shopping voucher for maternity wear. From 6 weeks prior to the birth of your child, you will receive a shopping voucher for basic equipment for your child. After your baby is born, on presentation of the confirmation of a birth, you will receive a voucher for purchasing a pram as well as 4 to 6 weeks after the birth, another shopping voucher for baby clothing. A baby cot and nappy-changing pad will be given to you in your accommodation facility. There you will first receive a shopping voucher for maternity clothes, and later a voucher for a pram as well as clothes and utensils for your child.





Notifying the registry office

Newborn children must be reported to the Register Office (Standesamt) and the accommodation management. The maternity clinic reports the birth to the Registry Office. There you will receive the (potentially provisional) birth certificate for your child together with your ID card, the birth certificate from the clinic and, if available, your marriage certificate.
