# Telephone and (publicly accessible) Internet

#### Public WLAN (Wifi)

#### **Public WLAN**

Many people don't have a private Internet or WLAN connection. Don't you either? Then you can use public hotspots. They are free of charge. There is usually no time limit on usage. However, you can often only use a certain number of MBytes.

**Be careful:** public Wi-Fi networks are usually not encrypted! Anyone on the same Wi-Fi network could access your data. And without you even realising it. There are a few things you should be aware of. For example:

- Switch off file and directory sharing on your smartphone. And do this before you use the hotspot.
- Pay attention to encrypted websites. The use of https sites is recommended. They use encryption.
- · Delete saved networks.
- Use VPN tunnels. Your data is then sent encrypted through the open WLAn.

The public Internet is generally fully usable. However, certain sites are often blocked. For example: sites with content that is harmful to minors or illegal.

# Information for asylum seekers

There is no legal entitlement to Internet access in Germany. That is why there is no WLAN in most accommodation centres for asylum seekers.

But you want WLAN? Some accommodation centres have a telephone connection. You can then sign a contract for WLAN yourself. You can share the contract with your flatmates. You can then share the costs. Talk to them about payment beforehand.

There are many Wi-Fi providers. They have different services. But they also have different prices. Think carefully about which contract you sign. Your helper group will help you find a good contract. Ask for help and advice.

Some contracts have a long term (e.g. two years). Other contracts have a short term. Pay attention to this. You have to pay for the contract for the entire term.

#### Before you sign a contract:

- · Talk to your accommodation provider.
- You need the technical requirements for WLAN. Check whether you have them.
- A technician must have access to the accommodation. You also need to clarify this with your local supervisor.

#### **Smartphone**

There are two different mobile phone contracts in Germany:

- Prepaid contract
- Term contract

The prepaid contract has no fixed contract term. This means that you pay a certain amount for a certain period of time (often four weeks). You do not have to cancel the prepaid contract if you no longer want to use it.

With a fixed-term contract, there is a minimum contract term. This means that you have to stay with a particular provider for a longer period of time. The contract is automatically renewed if you do not cancel. If you do not want the contract to be renewed automatically, you must cancel in writing. Pay attention to the cancellation period.

Ten important questions when concluding a contract:

- 1. How high is the basic fee? Does the fee increase after a certain period of time?
- 2. Is there a minimum monthly turnover (minimum costs per month)?
- 3. How long is the contract for (e.g. twelve or 24 months)?
- 4. If I do not cancel the contract, it will be automatically renewed. When do I have to cancel if I don't want to extend the contract?
- 5. How much does it cost to set up, switch and deactivate?
- 6. What is the billing cycle (60/1, 10/10)?
- 7. How much does a minute cost (external/own network)?
- 8. How much does a mobile phone with a contract cost and how much does a mobile phone without a contract cost?
- 9. How much does Internet cost?
- 10. How much do international calls cost?

It advises people with the right to stay. This includes asylum seekers in particular. Asylum seekers without good prospects of staying can also seek counselling. The counsellors are often also in shared accommodation. This means they can help you directly on site.

The counsellors not only help asylum seekers. Other people with a migration background can also seek advice.

 $\mathbb{Q}$  Do you need counselling? It's best to make an appointment. Then the counsellor will have plenty of time for you. That makes a lot of sense. Because many questions cannot be answered so quickly.

 $\mathbb{Q}$  There is a separate counselling service for young people. The youth migration service. Want to know more about it? The Integreat app will tell you <u>here</u>.

#### What does the refugee and integration counselling service do?

The refugee and integration counselling service helps with

- · Questions and problems regarding the asylum procedure
- Questions and problems in the context of integration after a positive asylum procedure
- Immigration to Germany.

The counsellors will also help you with applications.

Personal counselling is only possible by appointment. The counsellors are always available for specific communities. You can find the right contact person further down on the page. You will also find the contact details there.

# **Mobility**

# **Public transport**

There is a good public transport network (e.g. bus or tram) in Augsburg and the surrounding area. The Augsburger Verkehrs- und Tarifverbund (AVV) and swa (Stadtwerke Augsburg) are responsible for this network.

You can find all the important information on the AVV website:

There are free apps to download:

- AVV.mobil
- · App: swa FahrInfo

You need a **ticket** to travel by bus or tram. There are often checks on buses and trams. If you don't have a ticket, you will have to pay a fine. The second time, you will be reported to the police and fined a much higher amount. So make sure you always have a valid ticket with you!

# Fare zones and price levels

The area in which the AVV and swa operate is divided into zones. The price of the ticket depends on the number of zones travelled through. The more zones you travel through, the more expensive your ticket is.

Each zone corresponds to a price level.

Each zone is only counted once. For example, if you travel through zones 20, 10 and 20 again, you need a ticket of price level 2 or 2 stripes on the stripe card.

However, the outward and return journeys count as two different journeys.

• The city area of Augsburg comprises fare zones 10 and 20.





• The district of Augsburg comprises zones 30 - 70.

You can find the fare zone map<u>here</u>. The timetables with the fare zones are also displayed at the stops.

 $\mathbb{Q}$  Note: Your ticket is also valid if you change trains.

# The most important tickets

# **Germany ticket**

- For 49 euros a month, you can use all local public transport and travel throughout Germany.
- The Deutschlandticket is a subscription. This means that it is automatically renewed every month. But you can cancel it every month. Always by the 10th of each month at the latest (for example: 10th March) for the following month.
- You can order the Deutschlandticket <u>here</u>. It will then be played on your smartphone. You will need the "meinAVV" app for this. You can find the app in your smartphone's Apple or Google store.

# Discount ticket for students, trainees, civil servants or volunteers

- In Bavaria, these groups of people can get a discounted Deutschlandticket.
- The discount ticket costs 29 euros. It is also valid nationwide.
- This ticket will be available for trainees from 1 September 2023. Students can obtain it as a top-up ticket in time for the start of the 2023/2024 winter semester.
- The person's place of education or residence must be in Bavaria.
- To apply, you need proof of eligibility from your educational institution.
- You can apply for the discount tickethere.

# Stripe card

- 9 strips for flexible use (one strip per zone)
- Valid for 3 hours (no return and round trips)
- No take-away options (one strip per person and zone)

# Single tickets

- Single journey from A to B
- · Valid for 1 hour (no return and round trips)
- No take-along options
- 4 stops after boarding buses or trams, even across zone boundaries
- Transfer possible
- · You can find more information about single tickets here.





#### Day ticket

- · Any number of journeys on the selected day
- · For adults aged 15 and over
- For one person or groups (each additional person costs a surcharge)
- Up to 4 children under the age of 14 can travel free of charge.
- Valid Monday to Friday from 9:00 a.m., Saturday, Sunday and public holidays all day; valid until closing time (i.e. until the last bus or tram leaves).
- Please note: The names of the travellers must be handwritten on the day ticket!

# 365-euro AVV ticket for school pupils, trainees, interns and FSJ volunteers

The 365-euro AVV ticket is available for school pupils, trainees, interns and young people doing a voluntary social year. For €1 a day, you can travel as often as you like on trams, buses and trains throughout the AVV network - around the clock! You can pay for the ticket in instalments or all at once. You can find all the information here.

# Monthly travelcard for school pupils

Pupils do not have to pay for bus and tram travel themselves. They can submit an application. The costs for the monthly travelcard will then be covered.

For this, the journey to school must be more than 2 kilometres for pupils in grades 1 to 4. For children and young people from year 5 onwards, the journey to school must be longer than 3 kilometres.

#### Collective call taxi (AST), on-call bus

The call-and-collect taxi (AST for short) and the on-call bus operate when there are no regular bus or train connections. A taxi picks you up from the station or a bus stop, for example, and takes you to the door of your desired destination. The journey must be requested by telephone at least 30 minutes before departure. The regular AVV prices apply.

#### AktiVVO - minibus on demand

The minibus runs on demand without fixed stops and without a fixed timetable. The minibus journeys can be booked by telephone or in the "AktiVVO" app. Passengers can hop on and off at one of the AktiVVo stops or at the AVV regional bus stops within a short space of time. The fare for the AktiVVo corresponds to the regular AVV fares.

The AktiVVO minibus commutes in these regions:





- · Holzwinkel and Altenmünster, Roth- and Zusamtal
- Bobingen, Königsbrunn and Schwabmünchen

The AktiVVO only operates in these regions. It also does not travel to Augsburg. It does not travel to any places outside these regions.

# **Augsburg City Zone**

In the city of Augsburg, you can use the bus and tram free of charge at a total of 9 stations around Königsplatz and the main railway station. The free stops are one stop in each direction from Königsplatz and Moritzplatz.

# At night

With the night bus you are also mobile at night (0.30 to 4 am). The night buses run from Thursday to Sunday and on <u>public holidays</u>. Passengers require a special night ticket (also available on the buses).

Regional trains run on some routes. The regular AVV fare applies here.

#### **Bicycle**

Cycling is fun in the district of Augsburg! A well-developed network of cycle paths with excellent signposting makes cycling not only a sporting hobby, but also a healthy and inexpensive alternative to buses, trains and cars.

Here are a few tips for people who enjoy cycling:

- Always ride on the right-hand side of the road
- Don't cycle next to each other, but behind each other.
- If there is a cycle path, you must ride on the cycle path (always on the right-hand side of the road in the direction of travel).
- Only children up to the age of eleven are allowed to cycle on footpaths.
- It is dangerous if you hit the tram tracks with your tyres.

# **Purchase and repairs**

When buying a bike, make sure that it is equipped as follows and is therefore roadworthy. If your bike is not properly equipped, you will have to pay a fine if it is checked by the police:

- · Front and rear lights
- · Reflector front and rear
- Reflectors in the spokes (two per wheel)
- Reflectors on the pedals
- Bell
- Two independent brakes

E-scooters have become very popular in recent years. You can hire e-scooters in many places.

You don't need a driving licence. Anyone over the age of 14 is allowed to ride an e-scooter. However, you must adhere to certain traffic rules. Similar rules apply as for cyclists.

# German driving licence

You need a driving licence to drive a car in Germany. You have to get your driving licence at a driving school. You have driving lessons there. At the end you have a test. The test consists of two parts: A written part and a practical part. You have to pay for the driving licence yourself. You can drive a car on your own from the age of 18. Young people can get their driving licence at the age of 17. However, they are only allowed to drive with an adult. This is called "accompanied driving".

# Foreign driving licence

Would you like to drive in Germany? And you already have a driving licence from your home country? Then your driving licence may also be valid in Germany. However, you may also have to retake the practical and/or theory test.

The driving licence of people with EU citizenship is generally recognised.





Driving licences from third countries such as Syria, Iraq or Afghanistan are usually not recognised in Germany.

# **Opening hours**

Not all shops are always open for the same length of time. The opening hours vary.





# Opening hours from Monday to Saturday

- Most shops are open from Monday to Saturday. These days are also called "working days".
- Large shops are usually open between 7 am and 8 pm on weekdays. For example supermarkets or DIY stores. They do not take a lunch break.
- Smaller shops often have shorter opening hours.
- Sometimes there is a lunch break in smaller shops.

 $\mathbb{Q}$  You will find the opening hours advertised at each shop. You can usually find them on the front door. You can also ask a member of staff there at any time!

# On Sundays and public holidays

- Almost all shops are closed on Sundays and public holidays.
- Only some shops are allowed to be open. Petrol stations, for example. Sometimes you can also find a small selection of food or drinks there.
- There are special opening hours on some days. For example on Christmas and New Year's
  Eve. The shops will let you know in advance. For example, with a notice on the entrance
  door.

There are always Sundays open for business in individual municipalities. Shops are open on these Sundays as an exception. Open Sundays usually only take place once a year.

# Weekly markets

Many municipalities organise a weekly market at the weekend. The best place to find out when and where these take place is at your local town hall.

#### Online shopping

More and more people are shopping online. There are a few things to bear in mind.

# **Remember:**

Online shopping does not only have positive effects. Packaging material and returns are a burden on the environment. And local shops can't keep up with the competition on the





internet either. That's why many shops are closing. Local shops are empty. It is therefore worth considering what you order online or buy locally.

# What should I look out for when shopping online?

#### Reputable online shop or fake shop?

Do you want to order something online? Then you should find out about the online shop beforehand. Because not all platforms are reputable. So-called fake shops offer cheap goods that you don't receive after payment or that you receive in poor condition.

# How can I recognise a dubious online retailer?

· Conspicuously low price

The goods in the online shop are remarkably cheap? This is not always a sign of a fake shop. But you should take a closer look.

· Conspicuous Internet address

A well-known website suddenly shows inconsistencies? The domain extension has been extended (e.g. instead of ".de" it reads: ".de.com")? The Internet address contains the keyword "plants", but shoes are being sold? Then these are signs of a fake shop.

No legal notice:

Every online shop in the EU must have an <u>imprint</u>. If the legal notice is missing, it is a sign of a dubious online shop. However, scammers know this too. Therefore, make sure that the legal notice includes the following: Address, representative, e-mail address, reference to the commercial register. If these criteria are met, there is a high probability that it is a reputable shop.

Missing terms and conditions (general terms and conditions) and cancellation conditions

GTCs are pre-formulated contractual terms and conditions. They are therefore rules that apply to every purchase from this online shop. If you don't find any terms and conditions on the site, you should be careful with this online shop. A reputable online shop will provide information about the cancellation conditions. You have a <u>right of cancellation</u> for every purchase.

• Unsafe payment methods

Normally the rule is: first the goods, then the payment. However, many shops also offer prepayment. Prepayment means that you transfer the money before the goods are dispatched. Many payment methods are offered? But in the last step you can only select "prepayment" as the payment method? Then be careful!

· False quality seals





Many fake shops use quality seals to gain the trust of potential customers. Do you see a quality seal on an online shop? Then click on it. If the quality seal is <u>not</u> linked to the corresponding website, then it is probably a fake.

· Missing or only positive customer reviews

Customer reviews on the online shop's website are not always meaningful. Often only positive reviews are published. Bad reviews are deleted. However, you can also search for customer reviews on other platforms.

No encrypted connection

Make sure that the online shop has an encrypted connection. Especially if you have to enter your data or bank details.

• Insufficient product descriptions

Does the product description match the goods or services on offer? If not, it could be a fake shop.

· Defects in the offer

Before making a purchase, you should be informed about delivery times and shipping costs. Be careful if this is not the case.

Lack of contact options

Avoid online shops that only offer an email address or a paid telephone number as a contact option.

You can easily check whether an online shop is reputable with the **Fake Shop Finder** from the consumer advice centre: <u>Fake Shop Finder</u>.

# Tips for safe online shopping

- Be careful when entering your details. Of course, the online shop needs your name and address for delivery. But sometimes other information is also requested. Think about whether you really want to provide them.
- Choose online shops carefully. Pay attention to the criteria listed above.
- Compare the prices with offers in the shop. Not everything is cheaper on the internet.
- Pay attention to the total price: Is the price shown really the final purchase price (including taxes, customs duties and shipping costs)?
- Contact customer service if you are unsure about something.
- Read the experiences and reviews of other customers.
- Check again before you place the order: Which products are in your shopping basket? What are the delivery costs? Are there any additional taxes if the product comes from outside the EU?





• Print out your order or purchase contract, the product description and the terms and conditions and cancellation policy or save them on your computer. This way, the online retailer cannot change anything afterwards.

# **Public holidays**

No work is done on public holidays for religious or secular reasons. Shops and authorities are closed on these days.

The following public holidays are on the same date every year:

- 01.01. New Year
- 06.01. Epiphany
- 01.05. Labour Day
- 08.08. Peace Festival (only in the city of Augsburg)
- 15.08. Assumption Day
- 03.10. Day of German Unity
- 01.11. All Saints' Day
- 25.12. 1st Christmas Day
- 26.12. 2nd Christmas Day

Other public holidays change from year to year. You can find an overview of public holidays in Bavaria <u>here</u>.

# **School holidays**

School holidays are the times of the year when pupils are off school. In Bavaria, the new school year begins every year in September.

- Autumn holidays: There is a week around All Saints' Day (public holiday).
- Christmas holidays: There are two weeks around Christmas and New Year (public holidays).
- Winter holidays: There is one week of winter holidays in February.
- · Easter holidays: There are two weeks of holidays in spring
- Whitsun holidays: There are two weeks of holidays in early summer.
- Summer holidays: In summer, the school year ends at the end of July/beginning of August with six weeks of holidays.

# Time change

There is also a time change in Germany. This means that

- The clock is set forward one hour from winter to summer time. The night of the time change is therefore one hour shorter. It is dark for longer in the morning. But it is light for longer in the evening.
- From summer to winter time, the clock is set back by one hour. The night of the time change is therefore one hour longer. It gets light earlier in the morning. But it gets dark earlier in the evening.

The dates for the time change are

- Daylight saving time always begins on the last Sunday in March at 2 am. The clock is set forward from 2 o'clock to 3 o'clock.
- Winter time always begins on the last Sunday in October at 3 am. The clock is set back from 3 o'clock to 2 o'clock.

The dates for the time changeover in 2024 are

· Start of summer time: 31 March 2024

Start of winter time: 27.10.2024

# What are family support centres?

Family support centres are contact points for families. Specialists work there. They advise, inform and support families. If necessary, they can refer you to other help centres.

The family support centres also offer events. Each event has a specific theme. You can get information there. And you can exchange ideas with other parents. Some events take place online. You can find the events on the websites of the family support centres. Or here in the Integreat app in the "Events" category.

There are also often active programmes. For example, groups for children or mother-child programmes. It's best to enquire at your local family support centre!

 $\mathbb{Q}$  The advice and support provided by the family support centres is free of charge. So don't hesitate to contact them if you need help!

 $\bigcirc$  The specialists at the family support centres are bound by confidentiality. This means that conversations with them are confidential. The specialists are not allowed to tell anyone.

# When can you go there?

You can contact the local specialists with any questions you may have about your family. Topics can include Uncertainties in parenting, problems in school and education, questions about separation and divorce, behavioural problems, conflicts and crises in the family.

#### For example:

- My child can't sleep what can I do?
- We have a lot of conflicts in the family how can we deal with them?
- My child has problems at school how can I help him?
- I feel overwhelmed what can I do?
