Children, youth and family

Children, young people and families are under special protection in Germany. This protection begins during pregnancy. It lasts until the child is 18 years old (of age). In Germany, for example, it is forbidden to beat children. Education in Germany must not involve the use of violence. Every child must go to school. There are authorities that ensure that a child is not harmed by its environment (including the family).

Family planning

You are the only person who decides whether you want to have children, and how many children to have. Nobody can force you to have children.

Contraception

There are various methods for preventing pregnancy and/or avoiding sexually transmitted infections (STIs).

Unwanted pregnancy

If you are pregnant and do not want to have the baby, under certain conditions you can end the pregnancy with an abortion. Before you terminate a pregnancy, you must have a consultation. Make an appointment by telephone for advice on pregnancy issues with a state-approved counselling centre. The consultants will talk to you about the different options and answer all legal and medical questions. However, it is up to you to decide whether or not to terminate your pregnancy.

Pregnancy and childbirth

Expectant mothers are under special protection in Germany and are entitled to counselling, medical care and support with new acquisitions for the child. In case of pregnancy, always visit a doctor first and have the preventive medical check-ups carried out there. You will then receive a maternity passport, which identifies you as an expectant mother and also contains important information about your state of health and the of your child. Always carry your maternity card with you in case of emergencies.

General counselling for pregnant women at the District Office

General pre-natal care offers you the following resources:

- · Counselling on all personal, social, legal and financial issues
- Information about legal aid and support in making use of it
- · Arranging voluntary benefits from the state foundation "Help for Mother and Child
- · Longer-term support during pregnancy and after birth
- Prenatal diagnostic counselling

These counselling services are confidential and can be anonymous if you wish. You can go to counselling alone, with your partner or with another person who you trust. The counselling sessions are free of charge and the counsellors must keep them confidential.

Delivery and aftercare:

Your gynaecologist will refer you to a maternity clinic. In advance, ask for a midwife for post-natal care. You will receive a birth confirmation letter from the clinic.

Initial equipment:

As an asylum seeker, you will generally receive from the <u>»»Social Welfare Office</u> additional money and initial equipment for the child. Please get in contact with your claims administrator as soon as you have received your maternity record book (Mutterpass).

After giving birth: Notification to the registry office





Newborn children must be reported to the registry office and the accommodation management. The maternity clinic reports the birth to the Registry Office. There you will receive the (possibly provisional) birth certificate for your child together with your ID, the birth certificate from the clinic and, if available, your marriage certificate. Please give your accommodation manager a copy of the birth certificate so that your child can be registered.

<u>Note:</u> Please submit only original documents. For documents in a foreign language, an officially certified German translation is required.

Target group:

Expectant parents and single parents with children aged 0-6 in any (stressful) life situation

Childcare: Daycare centre and daycare for children

Day care centre Kita

What is a day care centre?

Kita is a term for a **day-care centre forchildren**. Here your child can make friends, learn to play and learn the German language. Attending a day care centre is an important and good preparation for school.

Crèche

Crèches are day care centres for children under the age of three.

Kindergarten

Kindergartens are day-care centres for children from the age of three until they start school.

• After-school care centre

After-school care centres are day-care facilities for school children. Your child can also do their school homework here.

Further offers for homework supervision

It is possible for the kindergarten to offer afternoon supervision for schoolchildren. Further information can be found in the concept of the individual kindergarten.

Kindergarten enrolment

Unfortunately, there are not always enough places in the kindergartens. Sometimes it is necessary to enquire at several kindergartens and have your child placed on the waiting list.

For the kindergartens in the Bad Kissingen municipal area, there is the option of online registration through the "Little Bird" programme _.

The <u>""Refugee and Integration Counselling Service</u> or the <u>""Migration Counselling</u> Service can help you with the registration.

Kindergarten costs

Attending kindergarten costs money.

Under certain circumstances, the costs for kindergarten can be covered. For example, if you do not yet have a job and receive benefits from the district office or job centre. To do this, you must





submit an application to the ""Youth Welfare Office.

Child day care

A childminder looks after your child in their home. She looks after a maximum of five children at the same time. Childminders have attended courses in which they have learnt how to look after children properly. The Youth Welfare Office regularly inspects the home and the childminder, so you can rest assured that your child is in good hands. If you are interested in this form of childcare and would like more information, the \tilde\textstyle "Jugendamt" can help you.

Advice centre for parents, children and teenagers

We provide advice to:

Unaccompanied foreign minors

The definition of "unaccompanied"

A foreign minor is considered unaccompanied "if they enter Germany without a parent or legal guardian". (Federal Ministry for Family Affairs, Senior Citizens, Women and Youth)





Definition of "minor"

Any person under the age of 18 (in other words, all children and teenagers) is considered a minor (cf. Section 7(1), points 1 and 2, of SGB VIII)

What happens to unaccompanied foreign minors when they arrive in Germany

- · Arrival in Germany: Learning personal data
- Provisional child custody
 - Determining age using documents, age estimation by at least two experienced social education workers
 - Medical screening (medical examination)
 - Initial discussion about reasons for asylum/fleeing home country
- Reallocation and distribution to a federal state, and eventually to a district within that state, such as Bad Kissingen
- Custody by the Youth Welfare Office, <u>»»Jugendamt Bad Kissingen</u>
- Clearing process: Determining whether the child/teenager needs help and working together to plan their future (guardianship, where to live, medical care, education, leisure activities)
- Accommodation for the child/teenager in a residential youth welfare institution appropriate for their level of need
- After conclusion of the residential youth welfare programme, possible follow-up support through visits and a legal guardian

Guardian

"A minor is given a legal guardian if they are not under the care of a parent..." (Section 1773 [1] of the BGB).

The guardian is the personal and legal contact person of the young person. This person represents and supports the young person, for example during the asylum process and when visiting public authorities.

The guardian's duties include:

- Parenting: Having initial conversations and participating in discussions of how to plan support
- · Encouraging development
- School, education, career
- Applying for asylum and support during the asylum process
- Decisions about residence (in accordance with asylum right of residence, reuniting families)
- Bringing family members to join the minor
- Managing contact, approving visits from relatives and friends
- Healthcare, approval for medical procedures, treatments and medication prescriptions
- Legal representation, e.g. during court proceedings, witness hearings by the police, etc.





- · Guardianship of the minor's property/assets, opening a bank account
- Transition of legal rights when the minor comes of age (transition from SGB VIII to SGB II)
