What you should know about Landkreis Gießen

Landkreis Gießen:

Landkreis Gießen is in the heart of Bundesland Hesse and part of the larger Gießen administrative district. Round about 260,000 inhabitants live in this area.

The "Landkreis" includes 18 towns and municipalities. These are: Allendorf (Lumda), Biebertal, Buseck, Fernwald, the town of Gießen, Grünberg, Heuchelheim, Hungen, Langgöns, Laubach, Lich, Linden, Lollar, Pohlheim, Rabenau, Reiskirchen, Staufenberg and Wettenberg.

Adjacent rural districts are Landkreis Marburg-Biedenkopf at the north, Lahn-Dill-Kreis at the west, Wetteraukreis at the south and Vogelsbergkreis at the east.

During the direct elections on 7 June 2009, Anita Schneider (SPD) won 54.8 per cent of votes. Since this time, she is the first female district administrator in Hesse. On 14 June 2015, her mandate has been confirmed by 62.1 per cent of votes. First full-time district counsellor is Dr Christiane Schmahl (Die Grünen) and the function of a full-time district counsellor is held by Hans-Peter Stock (Freie Wähler). President of the district council is Karl-Heinz Funck (SPD).

Living together in Germany

The constitution

Each individual country has rules, which must be followed by all people. The most important law for Germany is the constitution. It is a collection of 146 articles. Each article stands for a law, i. e. a rule. These rules are binding for all people living in Germany. The constitutional rights protect the freedom of each individual person. They are defined in articles 1 to 19 of the constitution (catalogue of constitutional rights).

Here is the German constitution in 11 languages:* »»<u>Arab</u>, »»<u>Chinese</u>, »»<u>English</u>, »»<u>French</u>, »»<u>Italian</u>, »»<u>Persian</u>, »»<u>Polish</u>, »»<u>Russian</u>, »»<u>Serbian</u>, »»<u>Spanish</u>, »»<u>Turkish</u> and of course in »»German.

Universal Declaration of Human Rights

Human rights are important rights that are valid universally for all people in the world. Human rights are inherent rights of each individual person as a human being. These rights equally protect the dignity of each individual person without any difference, e. g. for "(...) color, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status." (Art. 2 of the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights dated 10/12/1948).

In this declaration, 30 rights have been defined. The most important ones are:

- Every individual is of equal worth.
- Every person is entitled to have his or her own opinion.





· Right to live in peace and safety.

Children's rights

Children need special protection. For this reason, special rights have been defined. The individual rights of children are determined in the Convention on the Rights of the Child. The Convention has been adopted by the UN General Assembly in 1989 and ratified by 193 states. In total, the UN Convention on the rights of the child consists of 54 articles.
