People living with disabilities

Every person who is physically, mentally or emotionally disabled or at risk of such a disability has a right to help. No-one shall be disadvantaged because of their disability. This protection is regulated by law in Germany.

People with disabilities want to have the same quality of life as people without disabilities. They want to have mobility and be able to handle their everyday lives without help.

Contact persons and counselling / advice centres

EUTB (Supplementary Independent Participation Advice Centre)

The **Supplementary Independent Participation Counselling**Service offers **people with disabilities**, **people at risk of disability** and their **relatives information** on all aspects of living with a disability.

For example: Questions about assistance, care or aids.

The staff here will support you with the following:

- Applications for money
- Applications for aid
- Addresses of facilities (for example, a workshop for people with disabilities)
- Searching for a job
- Continuing education at work

"Behindertenbeauftragter" (Disability Officer)

The Disability Officer helps politicians and government offices when it comes to people with disabilities.

He should be consulted about important issues.





Politicians are then able to make informed decisions.

Anyone can call or write a letter to the representative for the disabled:

- in case help is needed
- to register a complaint
- This is called an ombudsperson. The Disability Officer is also an ombudsman.

The Disability Officer is responsible for accessibility. In other words: People can get anywhere they need to, without barriers, and can read, see or hear information, for example on the Internet.
