The German healthcare system, health insurance

The German healthcare system

In Germany, many institutions are part of the healthcare system. There are three areas:

- 1. Doctors' surgeries and pharmacies: they provide outpatient medical care. "Outpatient" means that you can go home again after treatment.
- 2. Acute care in hospitals in an emergency and inpatient medical care. "Inpatient" means that you stay in hospital for treatment.
- 3. Health protection: protection against infections and preventive services. "Preventive" means: services that maintain your health and help you avoid becoming ill.

Outpatient and inpatient care helps sick people. You can decide for yourself which doctor or facility you go to. This is called freedom of choice.

Health insurance

In Germany, it is compulsory to have health insurance. As soon as you have a residence permit, you must register with a health insurance company. You will then receive an insurance card, which you can use to access medical services throughout Germany. You are then entitled to the same services as all residents in Germany.

Hospitals treat emergencies. This means when people are seriously ill or have life-threatening injuries. For minor injuries or illnesses, you can go to a <u>doctor's surgery</u>. You will receive good help there.

You may also need a doctor at night or at the weekend. But it is not always an emergency. Then you can go to the <u>medical on-call service</u>.

If you have a toothache, you can go to a dental practice. There is an <u>emergency dental service</u> at weekends.
