# First points of contact

### Asylum seekers

#### Asylum

Have you come to Germany to seek protection from persecution or imminent danger in your home country?

- You can apply for asylum at the <u>state initial reception centre</u> in Bochum ( ♥ Gersteinring50, 44791 Bochum).
- During your <u>asylum procedure</u>, you will initially stay in centralised accommodation in the state.
- After successful completion of the <u>asylum procedure</u> or a certain time after rejection, you will be allocated a city in which you can or must live<u>(residence requirement)</u>.

 $\mathbb{Q}$  If you are under the age of 18 and unaccompanied by your parents, please contact the police or the integration office.

## <u>Assignment</u>

If you have already been assigned to the city of Neuss by the district government, the Integration Office (



Markt 2, 41460 Neuss) is your most important local contact for your <u>legal residence matters</u>. There you will

- Your permit/tolerance will be extended,
- · a decision will be made about a work permit,
- It will be discussed whether it is necessary to leave the country and under what conditions.

You must make an appointment for an interview.

#### **EU citizens**

#### Registration

As an EU citizen, you do not need a residence permit to live in Germany. You enjoy freedom of movement in Germany and may live, work and reside wherever you wish. You must register your place of residence in Germany at the <u>Citizens' Registration Office</u>.

# Third-country nationals

#### Registration

Have you come to Germany to study, work or live with your family? You probably already

have a visa and the Integration Office is already aware of your case.

- **Visa:** Regardless of whether you came to Germany with or without a visa, you must apply for a residence permit for the duration of your visa. This document allows you to stay in Germany for longer. The residence permit is issued by the Integration Office. You must apply for this document while your visa is still valid.
- Application: If you already have a residence permit and have moved to Neuss, you only need to re-register your place of residence. You can make an appointment at the <a href="Bürgeramt"><u>Bürgeramt</u></a>. There you can also download the form for the landlord's certificate of residence, which is required for registration.

# Important offices

#### Citizens' office and registry office

The <u>Citizens' Office</u> offers many services for the citizens of Neuss. The following are probably of particular interest to you:

- · Registration and re-registration in Neuss
- Identity card matters
- Notarisations
- Applying for a certificate of good conduct
- Registration matters after the birth of your child





- · Marriage matters
- · Change of address on documents
- · Registration certificate
- Registration information
- · Death matters

You will need this certificate from your landlord confirming that you have actually moved into the flat for registration purposes.

# Registry office

The registry office has several tasks:

- · Notarisation of births
- Marriages
- Issuing certificates
- · Notarisation of deaths
- · Change of name

#### O Births

A birth certificate is the most important document for a newborn and for you as parents. Only when your child has a birth certificate will you receive child benefit from the state and be able to apply for health insurance.

The hospital is responsible for informing the registry office of the birth of a new child. They will need the following original documents:

- Birth certificates of the parents
- Marriage certificate of the parents
- National passports of the parents





Be sure to bring these documents with you to the hospital for the birth. You will receive your documents back in the post after a few days.

If the father or mother was not born in the EU, you <u>must</u> have your <u>birth certificates and marriage certificates legalised and translated</u>. Your child cannot be registered at the registry office before this. Sometimes it takes several months before you receive the certificates. You should therefore contact your registry office(<u>Standesamt@stadt.neuss.de</u>) as soon as you find out about your pregnancy. They will tell you which documents you need to apply for and where.

#### Marriage

If you wish to get married, you must register this in writing at the registry office. If you would like to know which documents you need for the wedding, you can enquire here.

# Benefits under the Asylum Seekers Benefits Act (draft MMI)

Some people receive special support when they apply for asylum. The benefits are regulated by a law. It is called the Asylum Seekers Benefits Act. In short: AsylbLG. The law stipulates what kind of assistance people can receive during their asylum procedure or other legal proceedings.

This assistance includes, for example

A place to sleep food clothing Money for personal items

#### Who can receive benefits?

These people can receive benefits:

Asylum seekers
Persons with tolerated stay
Persons with foreign citizenship who have to leave the country

# How do you get the benefits?

You must submit an application. You submit the application to the **Integration Office**.

Do you have any questions? Then please contact the <u>responsible case officer</u>. The specialists will be happy to help you!

# **Employment Agency**

The Federal Employment Agency is responsible for everything to do with employment. If you are looking for a job, need help choosing a career in Germany, need your qualifications recognised or similar, the Employment Agency is your point of contact. In some cases, the employment agency will also cover the costs of job application training, a skills assessment (what can I do and how much is this in demand from employers?) or the provision of professional skills (including language courses). Talk to your responsible case worker about this.

The Employment Agency is responsible for you in the following cases:

- If your <u>asylum procedure</u> is still ongoing (Aufenthaltsgestattung)
- · If you have a tolerated stay permit
- If you have been recognised and have been employed for at least one year subject to social insurance contributions.

#### Job centre

If you have residence status and are unemployed or your salary is insufficient, the <u>job centre</u> will help you:

It will support you financially and help you find work. It will enable you to take part in a language course, arrange career counselling or have certificates recognised.

 $\bigcirc$  If you have a **residence permit** or a **tolerated stay permit**, the employment agency is responsible for finding you a job and possible qualifications. During this time, your contact for applying for financial benefits is the <u>AsylbLG benefits</u> department.

#### Social welfare office

The **social welfare office** is responsible for providing social assistance. This includes the following benefits:

Basic security in old age and in the event of reduced earning capacity

Care assistance

Assistance with living expenses

Integration assistance for disabled people

Assistance to overcome particular social difficulties

Assistance with health

Assistance in other life situations

The Social Welfare Office will advise and support you in all matters relating to these topics.

The social welfare office will ask you about your financial circumstances. You will therefore have to show whether you have any valuables such as jewellery or money. You will sign a number of documents and declarations. Please bring all your papers with you. All persons who are registered on your residence permit must accompany you to the appointment.

You will also receive the cheque for your living expenses here. You can exchange the cheque for cash (euros) at the bank. Please note that this money must last until your next appointment with the social welfare office (approx. 1 month). You will not receive any money until your next appointment with the Social Welfare Office.

#### Youth welfare office

The Youth <u>Welfare Office</u> supports parents and other guardians in bringing up children and young people. Anyone can contact the Youth Welfare Office free of charge, including children and young people if they have problems. Don't worry: the discussions are treated confidentially.

Responsibilities of the Youth Welfare Office:

- Supporting young people in their individual and social development
- Counselling and support for parents in parenting issues
- · Protection of children and young people
- · Positive living conditions for young people and families
- · Prevention and reduction of disadvantages

When your child is born, the youth welfare office will contact you after a few weeks to make a home visit and introduce themselves. You will then receive a whole folder of information and offers for your child and your family. You must register your child at the <u>registry office</u> in the first few days after the birth if possible. You can find more information <u>here</u>.

The Youth Welfare Office is also responsible for unaccompanied foreign minors. It works together with various organisations that offer accommodation and care and assume guardianship for the young people.
