Enjoying exercise is one thing. But sport offers you another opportunity: sport makes it easier to settle into a new environment and socialise. Aquapark Oberhausen

The design of Oberhausens 's new water world is characterised by the "black gold of the Ruhr". The AQUApark is the world's first mining adventure pool.

The aquapark covers 25,000 square metres. It consists of a sports pool and a leisure pool. There is also a fitness pool and fun pool. There is also an outdoor pool and a children's pool. There is also a wellness area.

Highlights include the longest X-Tube slide in Europe and the Black Hole slide. Everything you see here has been built in the character of the "Zeche".

Oberhausen Sports Association (SSB)

The city sports association (SSB) is the umbrella organisation for Oberhausener sports clubs. It is housed in the "Haus des Sports" with its sports department.

As a member of the state sports association NRW, SSB supports the promotion of sport. The association pursues charitable purposes. It is independent and politically neutral. It is the umbrella organisation for Oberhausener sports clubs and sees itself as a service provider. In addition, SSB is a service provider and partner to its affiliated clubs.

The SSB enables Oberhausener citizens to find and practise their sport. Age, gender and ability are not relevant. There are more than 220 clubs with 38,000 members in Oberhausen.
