

Test "Living in Germany" / naturalisation test

The test "Leben in Deutschland" (LiD) takes place at the end of an orientation course .

The test **LiD** has the same questions and the same examination procedure as the **Einbürgerungstest** but they are not equivalent. The LiD offers the opportunity to apply for the integration course certificate. With the Einbürgerungstest there is no such option. The LiD can be used both for naturalisation and for settlement permits. It is accepted by all authorities.

Both tests have 310 questions, including 300 general questions and 10 questions about the federal state in which you live. A test questionnaire has 33 questions that have to be answered in 60 minutes.

 $\mathbf{\hat{Q}}$ The **test LiD** is **passed** if **at least 15 questions out of 33** are **answered correctly**.

How can I prepare for the test "Leben in Deutschland" or the Einbürgerungstest prepare?

You can refer to the **test "Leben in Deutschland"** or the **Einbürgerungstest** online in the test centre of the <u>BAMF</u>s test centre and work through the questions interactively. After answering each question, you will be shown the correct answer.

You can also fill out a sample questionnaire on a trial basis. When you have answered all the questions, you will be shown which questions were answered correctly. At the end you can view the correct solutions with brief background information.
