Learning German in Regensburg

Integration course

What isanintegration course?

In an integration course, people learn German. An integration course has two parts:

- German course
- Orientation course

The integration course ends with two exams:

- German test for immigrants
- Living in Germany

You pass both exams:

- You receive the integration course certificate.

Who can do an integration course?

You are:

- Migrant with a residence permit for Germany
- EU citizen and live in Germany
- Asylum seeker with good prospects of staying
- Recognised refugee or have subsidiary protection
- \Rightarrow Then you can do an integration course.

IMPORTANT: Integration courses are not for children and young people.

They have to go to school.

Ask the counselling centres:

- Where can my children go to school?

⇒ Look at "Counselling and help"

What integration courses are there?

Integration course for all adults (700 hours, about 7 months) Integration courses for ABC (learning to read and write the Latin alphabet, up to 1,200; approx. 1 year) Integration course for second-language learners (learning the Latin script, 1000 hours) Integration courses for women (1000 hours, one lesson lasts 45 minutes) Integration courses for parents (1000 hours) Integration course for teenagers and young adults (1000 hours) Support course (if you have been in Germany for some time, 1000 hours) Intensive course (500 hours)

When do integration courses take place?

- The courses are often from Monday to Friday.
- The course lasts 4 or 5 hours in one day.





- There are also courses on a few days a week.
- These courses last longer.
- Do you have work? There are also courses in the evening and on Saturdays.

How do you find the right integration course?

Many German course providers (= language schools) in Regensburg offer integration courses. Search here on the **Internet**: <u>Search for an integration course</u>

Ask the migration advice centres.

=> Look under "Advice and help"

The German course organiser will carry out **a test.** This will put you on the right course. Ask the German course organisers: What documents do I need?

How much does the German course cost?

- Participants **without authorisation** from the **<u>BAMF</u>** (self-payers):

- 458 euros per month
- Participants with BAMF authorisation (without cost exemption):
- 229 euros per month
- Participants with BAMF authorisation and cost exemption :
- 0 euros
- ⇒ Do you have to pay? Ask your German course organiser

CampusAsyl's "Accompany - Support - Encourage" (BUF) project

CampusAsyl has started a new project. The project helps you learn German.

What does it do?

Help with learning German, homework help, language exchange, exam preparation, learning support

Who can take part?

You are currently attending an integration course or a vocational language course.

You are waiting for a free place on an integration course.

You are preparing for the exam for immigrants.

There are various offers.

You learn before the integration course:

How do I learn. How to find information. Practise reading and writing.

During the integration course you learn:





Repeat lessons. Answer questions. Help with homework. There is a quiet place to study.

Preparation for the "German Test for Immigrants" (DTZ) exam

Get to know exam questions. Practise writing and speaking. Repeat.

Conversation course for women

This course is for women only.

You have already done an integration course.

You can bring your small child with you.

The children are looked after and you can learn.

We mainly practise speaking but also reading and writing.

There is also a **language lounge** for practising German. Lots of games are played there. You can also meet new people.

German for the job

Job-related German courses (= learning German for your job):





What is a job-related German course?

There are **courses** for care, medical, office and technical professions.

- 1. The course prepares you for a profession.
- 2. The course helps you with your training or work.
- 3. The course builds on your integration course.

Who can take part in the job-related German course?

- You can already speak German well or very well(B1, B2OR C1).
- You are registered as a jobseeker (with the Employment Agency) AND/OR receive unemployment benefit.
- You receive money from the job centre.
- You are a foreigner, immigrant, EU citizen, German with a migration background
- You are a refugee: Ask your advisor at the employment agency or job centre.
 ⇒ The employment agency or job centre will decide whether you can take part

How can you register?

Ask your advisor at the employment agency or job centre. ->Your counsellor knows which course you can do. ->Your counsellor knows where there are courses.
