Authorities and Counselling

Public authorities

Below you will find the contacts of various authorities that are often important in the first time in order to arrange various things for your life in Rosenheim.

Citizens' office

Are you new in Rosenheim? Then you must register at the residents' registration office withintwo weeks . Children over 15 must come along to the registration.

IMPORTANT: You must also do this if you move within the city of Rosenheim.

- Identity card, passport or passport replacement document
 <u>For children:</u> Children's passport, child ID card or birth certificate
- Confirmation from the landlord

Immigration office

Are you new to Rosenheim and have already been to the Bürgeramt? Then you still need an appointment at the Foreigners' Registration Office. Everything about your residence will be clarified there.

Please bring all documents, proof of identity, passports and certificates from your home country.

Office for Children, Youth and Family

The Youth Welfare Office helps in many situations. The Youth Welfare Office helps children, young people and their families. The aim is to ensure that children are well. You can contact the Youth Welfare Office with many questions. Examples are



You have a child and are not married to the father. But you want him to be the official father. Then you can have the certificate drawn up at the youth welfare office.

You don't know whether you want to have joint custody. Then you can ask the youth welfare office.

You argue a lot in the family and you are worried about your child. Then you can ask the youth welfare office for advice.

You are a single parent and sometimes everything becomes too much for you. Then you can ask the youth welfare office for help.

Your child is doing worse and worse at school and no longer wants to go to school. Even talking to the school doesn't help. Then you can ask the youth welfare office for advice. You have separated and dad is not paying child maintenance. Then you can go to the youth welfare office and they will help you.

You are very worried about a child in your neighbourhood. Then you can call the youth welfare office and tell them about your worries.

Job centre

You don't have a job and are looking for work? Or have you lost your job after a few months?

If you meet certain requirements, you will receive money from the job centre. This financial help is called Bürgergeld.

If you're not sure, get some <u>advice</u>.

The job centre will also help you find a job. For example: If you are registered with the job centre, the job centre will send you information about vacancies.

Social welfare, housing, insurance and basic security office

This office has many different tasks. Here are a few examples of the tasks of this office.



You are an asylum seeker and live in the city of Rosenheim. You are ill and want to go to the doctor. Then you can apply for a sick note there.

You would like to apply for <u>education and participation</u>.

You would like to apply for housing benefit.

You would like to apply for social welfare.

You have a disability and would like to apply for a disabled person's pass.

You will be retiring in a few years. And would like advice about this.

Do you live on social assistance or citizen's allowance? Do you already know about the <u>"Green</u> <u>Pass</u>"? This means you have to pay less for many services offered by the city of Rosenheim. For example at the indoor swimming pool, the music school, the city library, the ice rink, ... You have lost your flat in the city of Rosenheim and are now homeless. Then ask for help at the social welfare office.
