

## Notfall - Emergency



In an acute emergency, treatment can be provided without the need for a health certificate. Go to a hospital or emergency room for this purpose.

If asylum seekers are admitted to a hospital due to an acute emergency, the clinic will immediately inform the district administration, social assistance department, and apply for the costs to be covered. The costs will then be settled between the hospital and the district administration.

If there are signs of acute  [trauma](#), specialist treatment is advised. Trauma work cannot and must not be carried out by volunteers! It is recommended that you contact a counselling centre. Attention: Trauma therapy often has to be financed by the affected person himself.

In case of pregnancy, it is advisable to visit a counselling centre  [Caritas](#) or  [Diakonie](#) or  [Sozialer Dienst katholischer Frauen](#). This can support both in applying for aid (for example, application for initial equipment) and in finding a midwife. A midwife is financed by the Social Welfare Offices (Sozialämter).
