If a ticket inspector asks to see your ticket and do not have a valid ticket, you will have to show your identity card and will be fined.

#### Cycling

#### What do you have to consider when riding a bike?

You can get anywhere at any time, quickly and at low cost. In Germany, and also in Schwäbisch Hall, there are special cycle paths. Cyclists must also follow the traffic rules.

#### Some important traffic rules for cyclists

- Always ride on the **right side of the road**.
- Do not ride next to each other, but **behind each other**.
- If there is a **cycle path**, you must use it (always on the right side in the direction of travel).
- Only children under 11 years of age are allowed to use the footpaths by bicycle.
- While riding, you may only wear headphones if you can still hear everything.
- You are not allowed to make calls (without a hands-free kit).



# Buying a bicycle

Make sure that your bicycle is **roadworthy** when you buy it. Otherwise, you will have to pay a fine if the police check your bicycle. The bicycle must be equipped with

- a bell
- two independent brakes
- a white light, front
- a white reflector, front
- a red tail light
- a red reflector, back
- four yellow spoke reflectors or reflective white stripes, on the tyres or spokes
- non-slip pedals, each with two pedal reflectors

# **Bicycle repair**


A broken bike can be repaired. You can find spare parts in bike stores or on the internet. There are also people who can help you repair your bike:

#### Exchange of driving licence





Doyou have a foreign driving licence and are moving to Germany?

Or: You live in Germany for at least 185 days a year?

Your foreign driving licence is valid for six months after your arrival in Germany. After that\_you will need a German driving licence. (Exception: persons from EU/EEA states.)

Driving licences are valid for 15 years.



#### What do you need to bring?

- Identity card or passport
- Confirmation of registration in Germany
- a biometric passport photo
- Foreign driving licence with translation, if no EU/EEA driving licence (translations are provided by recognised automobile clubs).

In the case of an **EU/EEA driving licence** and a driving licence from the following <u>Annex 11</u> <u>additionally</u>:

- · Certificate or expert opinion on physical and mental aptitude and
- Certificate or expert opinion on eyesight

In the case of a **non-EU/EEA driving licence** not listed in <u>Annex 11</u>, <u>additionally</u> (depending on the category applied for)

- · Certificate or expert opinion on physical and mental aptitude
- · Certificate or expert opinion on eyesight or an eye test certificate
- Proof of first aid training
- Details of the driving school, as you will also have to take the theoretical and practical driving test.

#### What do you get?

A valid driving licence for Germany

#### How to get a driving licence

If you have a **valid** driving **licence (non-EU/EEA)**, you must take a <u>theoretical and</u> <u>practical test</u> at a driving school.

#### This is how it works:

Register for the theory test (costs: 20 euros) at the TüV Süd Service Centre
Hallerstrasse 32

Bring along:



- Residence document
- Letter from the driving licence office
- Foreign driving licence with a copy of the certified translation
- Questions about learning: at the driving school (in several languages). You can take the test in different languages.
- Do you pass the theory test?  $\rightarrow$  **Yes**
- Register for the **practical test** at any driving school.
- How many hours of training before the test? The decision is made by the driving school. Costs approx. 42 euros per 45 minutes (pay at the driving school). Costs for the test: 90 euros (pay at TÜV/Hessental).

#### If you do not pass the test:

- Theory test: unlimited retake of the test. Costs 20 euros.
- **Practical test**: further driving lessons and retest possible. You must pay for the driving lessons and test.

#### If you pass the test:

- You can collect**your** driving licence from the **driving licence office** the day after the test.
- Please note: You must hand in your driving licence from your home country!

#### **IMPORTANT:**

Without a valid driving licence (original document), you must attend a driving school and obtain a new driving licence (like a novice driver).



#### **Opening an Account**


#### How do you open a bank account?

#### Girokonto (Current account)

In Germany, **every family** must have its own **bank account / checking account**, in order for the family's income (such as earnings, unemployment benefits, social assistance, child benefits) to be transferred to the account. Expenses such as **rent, electricity, telephone and other bills** can also be paid through this account.

For this reason, you must open a checking account at a bank (some banks are Sparkasse, Volksbank, Postbank or Südwestbank – there are others, too).





#### Where?

The bank of your choice

#### What do you need to bring with you?

Passport or identification document, Aufenthaltstitel (residence permit)

What do you receive? A card with the account number (you must keep this!)

#### **Education and participation**

#### Services for education and participation

Children, adolescents and young adults can receive even more support (e.g. for music school, holidays, leisure time, sports activities, etc.). This support is called: Benefits for education and participation (Leistungen für Bildung und Teilhabe). Many people also call it: the education package (Bildungs-Paket). This means that you will have to pay less money, or even none at all.

You must submit an application.



### Hall voucher booklet for children and teenagers

Families who receive unemployment benefits (Arbeitslosengeld II / Hartz IV), social welfare or benefits from the Asylum Seekers Benefits Law (Asylberwerberleistungsgesetz) or can claim housing benefits can receive the Hall voucher booklet for their children.

The voucher booklet is worth 60 euros and is given to each child between the ages of 3 and 21 years in an eligible family. The family and children must reside in Schwäbisch Hall as a prerequisite. The parents receive the vouchers from the Fachbereich Zentrale Steuerung, Abteilung Jugend, Schule und Soziales (Central Management Department, Department of Youth, Schools and Social Welfare) upon presenting the current decision confirming their unemployment benefits (Arbeitslosengeld II/Hartz IV), social welfare, housing benefits or benefits given to asylum seekers.

The booklet provides 30 euros which must be used to pay for courses at the Schwäbisch Hall Adult Education Centre (Volkshochschule). The remaining 30 euros are free to be used in a variety of ways, such as for admission to the Schenkensee swimming pool, Wackershofen Open Air Museum, to the cinema or to pay for recreational activities at the city's Child and Youth Work programme at Heimbacher Hof.

An open-air theatre, Freilichtspiele Schwäbisch Hall, also sponsors tickets for family-friendly performances at the Hall Globe Theater for children aged 5-11 accompanied by an adult, or for teenagers aged 12 and up to attend a performance at the Hall Globe Theater or on the Große Treppe (stairs outside the Church of St Michael).



Seniors aged 60 and over who receive a basic income or housing benefits and whose primary residence is in Schwäbisch Hall are eligible for the Hall voucher booklet for seniors (Haller Gutscheinheft für Seniorinnen und Senioren). The voucher booklet is worth 70 euros and can be redeemed for the following services, depending on need:

- ÖPNV (Public transportation) Stadtbus Schwäbisch Hall GmbH (through the Kolibri card)
- Taxi fares
- · Chemist's shops
- Meals on wheels (ASB, AWO, DRK)
- VHS
- City library

### State family voucher booklet

Families with **at least three children who are eligible for child support (Kindergeld)** may apply for the state family voucher booklet (Landesfamilienpass). It is also available to families with a **child with disabilities** (at least 50 percent reduced earning capacity) and for **single parents** with at least one child who is eligible for child support (Kindergeld) living in the household. Families with at least one child who is eligible for child support (Kindergeld) can also receive discounts if they provide proof of their eligibility for SGB II benefits or child support supplements. Families who receive benefits under the Asylum Seekers Benefits Act (Asylbewerberleistungsgesetz) and with at least one child living in the household can also receive a state family voucher booklet.

You are guaranteed **free or reduced admission to more than 140 destinations in the state**. You can find a list of all state castles, gardens and museums in the state of Baden-Württemberg, as well as additional information on the website of the <u>Ministry of Social</u> <u>Affairs and Integration</u>.





#### How do I separate different types of waste?

In Germany, we separate waste (recycle). Please make sure that you always throw away waste in the correct dustbins:

- Paper goes in the blue bin,
- Plastic and packaging in the yellow bin or in the yellow refuse bags,
- the remaining waste goes in the black bin,
- Glass goes in the bottle bank,
- Organic waste (compost) such as scraps of fruit, lettuce or other vegetables, potato peels and eggshells, coffee grounds, teabags or food scraps can be disposed of in a compost bin (brown bin) if you wish. If you do not have a compost bin, this type of waste must be disposed of with the remaining waste.



#### Internet/TV

#### Internet

- Everyone must bear the costs for the Internet themselves. These costs are not covered by the job centre.
- You can choose your own internet provider.
- It is important to note that the minimum contract term is usually 24 months. Cancellation is only possible in special cases.

### Television

Rundfunkbeitrag Every household in Germany has to pay the television licence fee (GEZ). Some can be exempt from Rundfunkbeitragspflicht.

#### **Exemption from Rundfunkbeitragspflicht**

If you receive benefits from the job centre, you are exempt from Rundfunkbeiträgen. You must submit an application for this. The printout from the job centre, which is enclosed with every grant notification, serves as proof. The exemption is only valid for the duration of the authorisation and must be repeated with each new authorisation.

#### **Note for asylum seekers**

You have no legal entitlement to television (TV) in your asylum accommodation. This means that there does not have to be a TV in your accommodation. If you do have TV in your accommodation, you may be sent a bill via Rundfunkbeitrag (GEZ). Do not pay the bill, but show it to your accommodation manager.
